LAMB OF GOD



THE LAMB OF GOD

“Behold the Lamb of God!” We hear this phrase every Sunday at Mass, but there’s a good chance that many Roman Catholics would not know who in the Bible originally spoke this phrase. Some may be surprised that it appears in only one of the four Gospels, and after it is spoken two times, it never appears again. It is John the Baptist who twice utters this phrase in the Gospel of John. In today’s Gospel reading, John proclaims Jesus as the Lamb of God, and two of John’s own disciples then follow Christ. A little bit later Andrew, who heard John and then followed Jesus, brings his brother Simon to be re-named Cephas, or Peter. A careful look at these Bible verses shows us the mission of everyone baptized into the Body of Christ: We must always proclaim our faith in Christ, so that others will follow him. Even though we do not know how the will of God might work through those we bring to Christ (could Andrew have known the destiny of his brother?), that is not the point. The point is that our ongoing mission as a church—one, holy, catholic, and apostolic—is to bring others to Christ. We do not seek attention, glory, or followers for ourselves, but only for the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world.

Dear Sister Parish Partners at St. Pius X Parish, Fr. John gave me the gift cards your parish sent to help out our migrant workers and families. Wow! The generosity of your parishioners is overwhelming. I cannot express how grateful we are for all this help. I have been very badly hit in several ways by the economic downturn. We have been giving out food like there’s no tomorrow. Where we used to give out three or four packages of food a week, I gave out 10 or 12 packages last Thursday alone. I cannot keep food on the shelves. I will be able to get some food with the gift cards sent by your parishioners. Also, I will be able to begin stocking up on blankets for when the migrant workers return. The planting-season workers came in November and left just before Christmas (planting onions). Other workers will come in March or April to harvest the onions, and probably stay until around June. With what you sent this year, we should have plenty to help provide for these and other needs. Thank y’all so much!

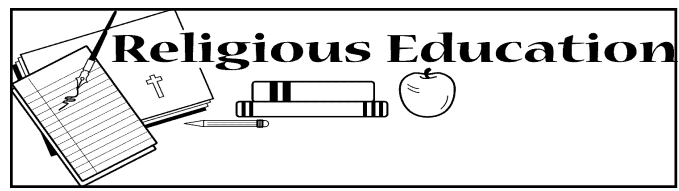

“Eli understood that the Lord was calling the youth. So he said to Samuel, ‘Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply, ‘Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening.’”

+ The first reading from Samuel tells of Samuel’s prophetic call during his slumber. Have you ever been awakened by something pressing on your heart or mind. *Have you used that time to ask the Lord to reveal Himself in the midst of your concerns?* Maybe the Lord is trying to get your attention. He could be urging you to take some time to pray for your concerns and to listen to His answers.

In his letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul urges the community to respect one another. They each are temples of the Holy Spirit, Who dwells within them. United as the body of Christ, their words and actions impact not only themselves, but everyone. That means Jesus Christ. *How do you treat others?* That is how you treat the Lord. Your response to others is your response to Christ.

John’s gospel proclaims Jesus as the Lamb of God and confirms Jesus’ public mission to call each of us to discipleship, beginning with Andrew and Peter. *How have you heard Christ’s call to you? Has He used others?* He is inviting. *Are you listening?* May your heart sincerely respond, *“Speak for your servant is listening.”*

That they may become one in your hand.



“The word of the Lord came to me: Mortal, take a stick and write on it, 'For Judah, and the Israelites associated with it'; then take another stick and write on it, 'For Joseph (the stick of Ephraim) and all the house of Israel associated with it'; and join them together into one stick, so that they may become one in your hand. And when your people say to you, 'Will you not show us what you mean by these?' say to them, Thus says the Lord God: I am about to take the stick of Joseph (which is in the hand of Ephraim) and the tribes of Israel associated with it; and I will put the stick of Judah upon it, and make them one stick, in order that they may be one in my hand. When the sticks on which you write are in your hand before their eyes, then say to them, Thus says the Lord God: I will take the people of Israel from the nations among which they have gone, and will gather them from every quarter, and bring them to their own land. I will make them one nation in the land, on the mountains of Israel; and one king shall be king over them all. Never again shall they be two nations, and never again shall they be divided into two kingdoms. They shall never again defile themselves with their idols and their detestable things, or with any of their transgressions. I will save them from all the apostasies into which they have fallen, from all the settlements in which they have sinned and will cleanse them. Then they shall be my people, and I will be their God. My servant David shall be king over them; and they shall all have one shepherd. They shall follow my ordinances and be careful to observe my statutes”.

(Ezekiel 37:15-19, 22-24a)

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity gives Christians an annual opportunity to continue their quest for the unity they already share in Christ.
