THE DEMANDS OF DISCIPLESHIP

Christmas is less than a month behind us, but today we are encountering readings that already have a Lenten feel about them. Nineveh undergoes a forty-day fast, the psalmist reminds us that God alone can show sinners the way, Paul shows us how fleeting the things and events of this world are, and Jesus calls out "Repent!" before he calls his new followers. Even though it is easy to misunderstand these Sundays called "Ordinary Time" as being commonplace, they are anything but that. "Come after me," Jesus says, but if we truly live out the commands and demands of our discipleship through baptism, we will first know our need for conversion, our repentance, our need to believe in the gospel fully in order to live out whatever vocation Christ has called us to. Today's Gospel opens with the stark reminder of what befell John the Baptist for completely living out his vocation as the herald of Christ and the gospel: he was arrested and imprisoned. Though few of us will experience consequences that extreme, we must all be ready to risk some sort of rejection as, heeding the call of Jesus, we live out the kingdom of God at hand, repent of our sins, and believe in the good news of salvation.

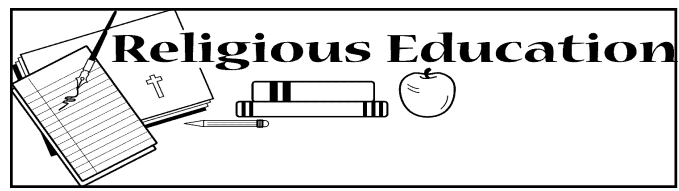

PASTORAL CARE NEWS

“This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the gospel.”

+ In his first reading, Jonah, still reveling in God’s mercy extended toward him after his rebellion, calls the people of Nineveh to conversion. Because of their repentant hearts he bring the Lord’s hope and mercy to them. *How do you respond when your spirit senses your own betrayal of your Baptismal call? Do you show your repentance by changing your ways?*

In his letter, Paul proclaims to the Corinthians that ***“time is running out”***. They must be ready for the Lord’s return. Truly all of us must be ready for the Lord’s appearance at any time. That means that we need to look at our priorities. Jesus must always be number one. We cannot cling to anyone or anything else. *To what or to whom do you cling? Where do you find your security? In your financial assets? In your home? In your church community and its beliefs? In your government? In your family and friends? Can you rely solely on Christ?* Paul urges us to be attached to Christ alone. You can trust Him!

Mark’s gospel speaks of Jesus’ radical to discipleship. He commands Simon, Andrew, James and John to ***“Come”*** follow him. Their decision changed their lives. God is calling you too. *“Come.” Are you following Him? How much? How far? Has your decision as a Catholic Christian made a difference in how you live your life each day?*

All your decisions are determined by your relationship with Christ. *Do you make your decisions, as if, looking through the eyes of Christ?* When you do, then God’s kingdom is revealed and His gospel proclaimed through you.

A Big Thank You from Our Sister Parishes

Dear Sister Parish Partners at St. Pius X Parish, Fr. John gave me the gift cards your parish sent to help out our migrant workers and families. Wow! The generosity of your parishioners is overwhelming. I cannot express how grateful we are for all this help. I have been very badly hit in several ways by the economic downturn. We have been giving out food like there's no tomorrow. Where we used to give out three or four packages of food a week, I gave out 10 or 12 packages last Thursday alone. I cannot keep food on the shelves. I will be able to get some food with the gift cards sent by your parishioners. Also, I will be able to begin stocking up on blankets for when the migrant workers return. The planting-season workers came in November and left just before Christmas (planting onions). Other workers will come in March or April to harvest the onions, and probably stay until around June. With what you sent this year, we should have plenty to help provide for these and other needs. Thank y'all so much!
