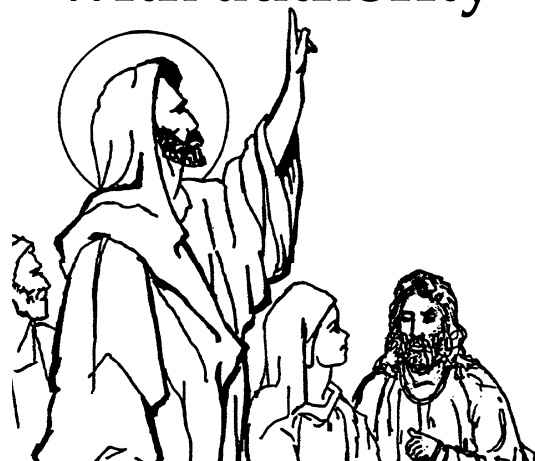

Jesus taught with authority



TRUE PROPHET

In Deuteronomy today we hear that God’s very words will fill the mouth of a true prophet, but a false prophet will, in a manner of speaking, put mere mortal words into God’s mouth. In Mark’s Gospel, we see Jesus teaching and healing as a true prophet, one filled with the authority of God’s own voice, the Holy One of God. There are, no doubt, both false and true prophets around us today. The whole history of our church is filled with both. Some false prophets were extremely popular and quite well-versed in scripture, and even held positions of church authority. But in today’s Gospel we learn that Jesus’ fame spread because he taught with authority; he wasn’t an authority because he was popular or famous. Elsewhere, we also learn from him, in his desert temptation confrontations with Satan, that anyone can quote scripture, even against God’s purposes. Today we hear that his authority was not like that of the scribes, who held the official positions of religious authority in his day. Our work is to do our best to discern the true prophets in our midst, and to be true prophets as well. The psalmist tells us how to do this: by not hardening our hearts when God speaks. If we truly listen to God, it will be God’s very words filling our mouths.

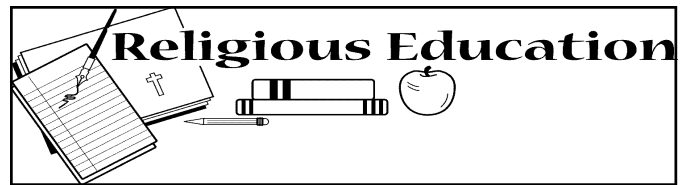

PASTORAL CARE NEWS

“And the Lord said to me, ‘...I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their kin, and will put my words into his mouth; he shall tell them all that I have commanded him.’”

+ In the first reading from Deuteronomy, Moses, as prophet, proclaims to the Jews the promise of another prophet, a promise fulfilled by Jesus. *As a disciple of Christ how do you fulfill your own prophetic call? Or do you?*

In his letter, St. Paul urges the Corinthians to free themselves from all anxieties. Their concerns distract them from living out and doing God’s work. *What worries preoccupy you? Can you turn these concerns over to God’s care so you can focus on what is really important? Do you ask the Lord to help you resolve your problems? Do you wait patiently for answers? Do you seek your own or His solutions?* These anxieties may be the very things that keep you from fulfilling your prophetic call to witness your faith. Your pre-occupations become your life and there is no room for God to work. Worry is your life! Paul wants us to make Christ our life!

In Mark’s gospel we see Jesus fulfilling the prophetic role promised in today’s first reading. His fame spreads throughout Galilee because of the authority from which he spoke and the blessings of God revealed through His work. His complete focus was on God’s will, anxieties were set aside. Whatever the cost, and whatever others thought didn’t matter. His Father’s will was His priority. *What is your highest priority?* It cannot be your own comfort. As His disciples it is imperative for us to follow His example and rely totally on the Father’s mercy and love. It is the necessary step to live your Baptismal call as a prophet in this day and age. Our world is longing to hear the prophetic call of faith. *Will you be it?*

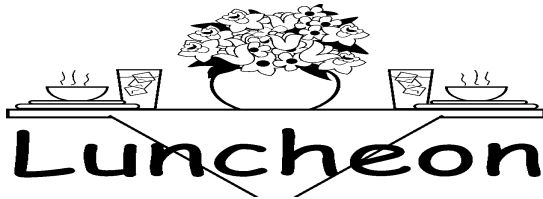


A Family Perspective by Bud Ozar
