GOD’S CALL

In today’s scriptures we hear three instances of people receiving and responding to a call from God. These accounts follow the pattern of most scriptural call narratives: a divine presence appears and speaks; the person expresses fear or unworthiness, receives encouragement, and finally responds to God’s call. Today’s first reading shows an unworthy Isaiah responding to the Lord’s call, “Here I am; send me!” (Isaiah 6:8). In the second reading Paul tells us that, even though he had persecuted the church, he was called to be an apostle. In the Gospel, despite Simon Peter’s protest that he is a sinner, Jesus calls James, John, and Simon to follow him. They leave everything they have and follow Jesus—that is, they become Jesus’ disciples. These scriptures can challenge us to take stock of our lives. How do we experience Jesus’ call to discipleship in our lives? How well and faithfully are we responding?

Albany Diocese to participate in “Postcard Campaign”

The Diocese of Albany will participate in the U.S. Bishops’ Justice for Immigrants postcard campaign soon after Pope Benedict’s message on migration and while the image of Jesus the Immigrant is still fresh in our minds. Parishioners are invited to sign postcards to our U.S. representatives and senators that call on them to adopt legislation that keeps families together, creates a legalization process for undocumented immigrants and employs humane border enforcement strategies. The postcards will be sent in a large batch with others from parishes throughout the diocese to the U.S. Bishops’ Justice for Immigrants Campaign, and staff will distribute them to legislators en masse during a special event in D.C., to demonstrate widespread support for comprehensive immigration reform.

The Catholic Church has historically held a strong interest in immigration and how public policy affects immigrants seeking a new life in the United States. Based on Scriptural and Catholic social teachings, as well as her own experience as an immigrant Church in the United States, the Catholic Church is compelled to raise her voice on behalf of those who are marginalized and whose God-given rights are not respected.

The Church believes that current immigration laws and policies have often led to the undermining of immigrants’ human dignity and have kept families apart. The existing immigration system has resulted in a growing number of persons in this country in an unauthorized capacity, living in the shadows as they toil in jobs that would otherwise go unfilled. Close family members of U.S. citizens and lawful permanent residents must wait years for a visa to be reunited. And, our nation’s border enforcement strategies have been ineffective and have led to the death of thousands of migrants.

The Church has a responsibility to shine the message of God on this issue and help to build bridges between all parties so that an immigration system can be created that is just for all and serves the common good, including the legitimate security concerns of our nation.

The date of this postcard campaign will be announced in an upcoming bulletin.

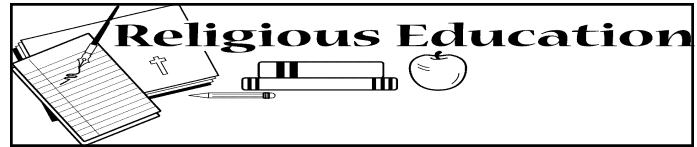

PASTORAL CARE NEWS

"Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?' 'Here I am,' I said, 'send me!'"

+ In the first reading Isaiah writes of his prophetic call. Amazed by the magnificence and splendor of God and astounded by His strength and power, Isaiah becomes humbly aware of his own sinfulness and vulnerability. Through angelic intervention he receives the forgiveness and healing he needs to eagerly take up God's call and mission for him. *Has God's awesome presence ever overwhelmed you? Has fear seized your heart when you reflect on your own unworthiness and human frailty? Has your outward insignificance kept you from answering God's call for you?* Allow the Lord to heal your fears and misgivings today.

In his letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul recounts his own sinful nature, healed by a divine encounter with the Risen Lord. Because of Jesus' merciful intervention in his life, he eagerly and humbly passed on to the Corinthians God's grace through his proclamation of the gospel and with it an invitation to conversion. With his letter he wishes to strengthen and intensify their commitment to Christ so they will be ready when they are called to share the grace of conversion with others. *Is the Lord calling you to intensify your commitment to Him? Is He calling you to walk with others on the road of conversion? Is He asking you to share your faith so others may grow and be strengthened for their mission? Are you open to whatever way He leads you? Does your heart reply enthusiastically, "Send me!"?*

Luke's gospel relates an account of Simon Peter, James, and John's fishing trip. After an all-night affair and no luck, overwhelmed with fatigue the threesome decide to repair their nets and call it "a day". Jesus has other plans, asking them to provide the boat and support for His "Teaching and Preaching Day." Their "YES" led to an abundant catch of fish and people. *Do your plans help you avoid Jesus' requests of you? Do you let discouragement and fatigue keep you from answering Christ's call on your heart? Are you ready for the new opportunity to serve the Lord with His grace? Will you say "Yes" this time?*

Maybe you are longing for an encounter with the Risen Lord like Paul had. Or you are wishing the Lord would enter your world amid the drudgery or disappointments of your daily life like Peter and His companions. Invite Him. He has need of faithful disciples. Like Isaiah show your willingness with this response...

Here I am Lord, send me!

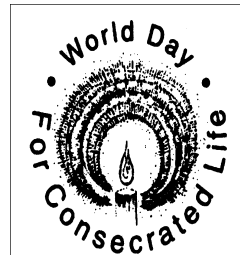

The occasion is celebrated in the United States on the Sunday following Feb. 2, to enable as much participation as possible. World Day for Consecrated Life marks an opportunity to highlight the extraordinary contributions of men and women religious in

this country as well as a time to pray for vocations to the consecrated life.

"The Church is greatly blessed by the many contributions of consecrated men and women, through their ministries in the areas of education, health care, spiritual formation and social service." said Cardinal Sean O'Malley, OFM Cap., chairman of the U.S. Bishops' Committee on Clergy, Consecrated Life and Vocations. "In particular, I wish to take this opportunity to acknowledge the service given by consecrated women, those who established the foundations in past generations and those serving in our midst today. Also, in this Year for Priests, we extend our gratitude to religious order priests for their ongoing work of helping to build up the Church. May this day provide all religious women and men an opportunity to experience a renewal of their vocation and commitment to consecrated life."

A traveling exhibit on the contributions of women religious in the United States, Women & Spirit, will be on display at different museums in the nation during the year. PLEASE NOTE: We cannot prepare 1040 long forms with itemized deductions.

You must bring the following items to your appointment:

- Original Social Security cards for self and dependents
- Last year’s tax return
- All W-2 forms
- All 1099 forms
- Voided check if you want to receive your refund through direct deposit
- Savings account routing number for direct deposit

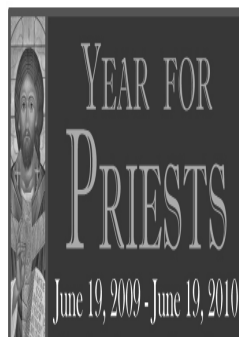
