TIRELESS DISCIPLESHIP

The Gospel of Mark, unlike those of Matthew and Luke, has no infancy narrative, nor does it have a lengthy prologue to introduce it, as John's Gospel does. In Mark's account, one could say, Jesus hits the ground running. The stories we've been hearing these weeks come from the very first chapter of Mark, and they show us the public ministry of Jesus in its infancy. Today's account shows some of the strain or adjustment of his new life of preaching the reign of God, healing the sick, and casting out demons. Notice that after sunset, when darkness ended the workday, people brought the sick and possessed to Jesus. The following day he rose before dawn to get away by himself to pray, but to no avail. Simon Peter and the others don't just look for him, they pursue him, filled with the fervor that his ministry has incited. With the self-sacrificing example he gave until the end of his earthly life, he tells his followers that this is his whole purpose. Through Mark, he is also telling the early church, and he is telling us, that this is our purpose, our vocation: to be tireless in our pursuit of proclaiming the Good News, and in bringing the healing, reconciling touch of Christ to the world.

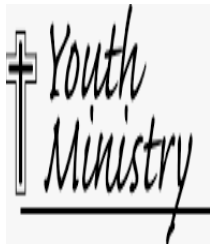

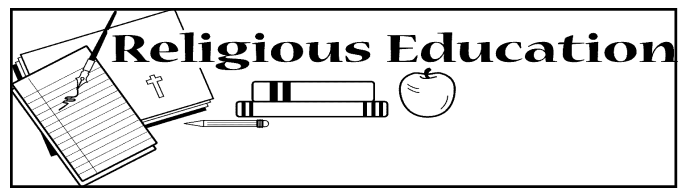

Christopher DeGiovine, Dean of Spiritual Life and Chaplain at The College of St. Rose; Professor Eloise Briere, SUNY Albany professor of Caribbean studies; and Dr. Elmise Jean-Pierre, physician and participant in a 2008 medical mission to Haiti. Despite the country's dire poverty, Haitians are hard working, resourceful and resilient people. You are invited to come hear and discuss how we might help.

PASTORAL CARE NEWS

“Simon’s mother-in-law lay sick with a fever. They immediately told him about her. He approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up. Then the fever left her and she waited on them.”

+ In the first reading Job wrestles with his faith amidst his troubles, suffering and despair. He can no longer remember the joy he once experienced. And he sees no hope or redemption in the future. He doesn’t know the fulfillment of God’s promise we experience with Christ - our savior who conquers suffering, pain, and death. Yet ultimately, he hangs on, trusting God to be faithful to him. *When troubles and tragedies overwhelm you, how do you respond? Do you wallow in your misery or seek God’s mercy and compassion with hope? Have you ever considered that your struggles and suffering are part of God’s plan for your spiritual growth?*

St. Paul, in his letter to the Corinthians, expresses his own difficulties and challenges in his life of faith. As an apostle of Jesus, he admits there are times he unwillingly takes on his obligations to preach the gospel. He is entrusted and commissioned to proclaim Christ’s love and sacrifice to the weak and vulnerable. Under no circumstance can he abandon his responsibility. *Do you follow Christ’s bidding even if it is difficult and uncomfortable? Whether it is convenient or inconvenient? Whether you want to or not? Even when you are UNWILLING?* Today He is calling you to a greater and more profound spiritual growth. **BE WILLING!**

Mark’s gospel speaks of two important aspects of Christ’s life. His life of prayer, expressed communally in the synagogue and privately in a deserted place and His life of service conveyed through individual and large group experiences.

Jesus revealed God’s enduring words of love, compassion, healing and grace to his closest friends and family and to the strangers in the crowd. He spoke the Father’s words of life in all He said and did, preaching the gospel in every way. For Peter’s mother-in-law the moment was transforming. His healing grace brought faithful service. For the ill and possessed, life changes challenged whole towns to a new way of seeing God. *How have you changed when God has touched you with His healing touch? Have you committed your life to serving Him? Have you shared your experience so others might see God in a new way? Are you WILLING?*

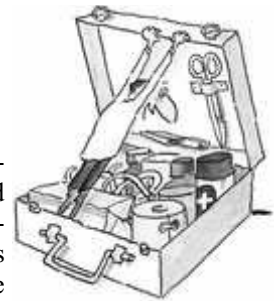

Free Tax Preparation Program: Beginning in February, Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Albany will prepare your 1040 or 1040EZ short forms free of charge by certified tax preparers. In order to use this service, your combined income *must be less than \$42,000* and you must qualify to file the 1040A or 1040EZ short forms. We do not prepare 1040 long forms with itemized deductions. Appointments will be available from February 3rd until April 14th. 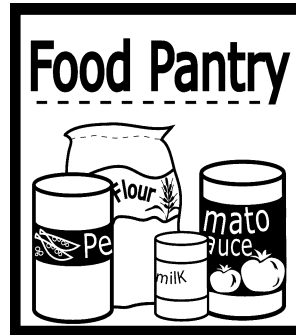

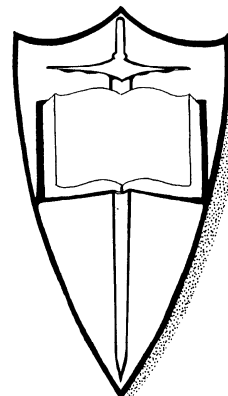
