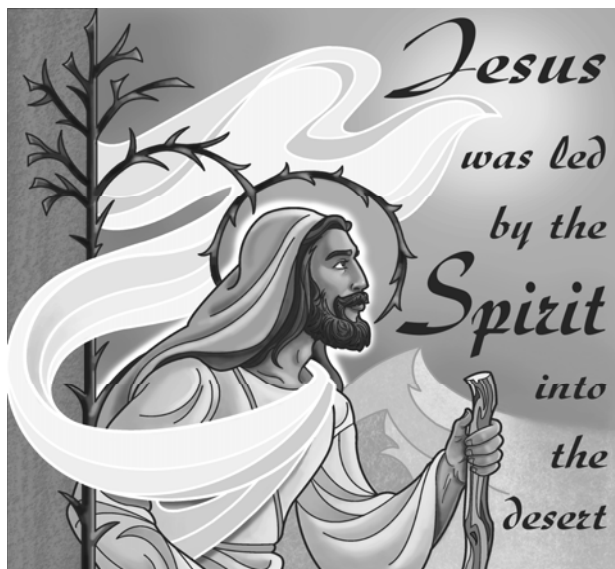

REMEMBER

Once again the Church invites us to enter the desert of repentance. That desert, as today’s first reading reminds us, is also a desert of remembrance. This holy season summons us to remember all that God has done for us. Like the Israelites who recalled their captivity and God’s work to free them from the Egyptians, we, too, recall those times when we were held captive by sin and experienced freedom through the gift of God’s redeeming love.

Saint Paul tells us that the word of God is near us; it is in our mouths and in our hearts. May that sacred word prompt us to remember God’s great work of reconciliation in our lives and in our community. As this season of Lent unfolds, let us take to heart these words of Saint Paul and spend these forty days calling upon the name of the Lord, asking for forgiveness and healing.

This Weekend the second collection is the annual **Black, Native American and Latin American Collection**. This annual collection, established by the Church in 1885, advances the Church’s mission of evangelization and of compassionate response to the plight of some of the neediest people in our country and in Latin America. The purpose of this annual appeal is to assist dioceses unable to support missionaries in their ministry on behalf of African - American and Native American people in the mission areas in which such economic hardship and deprivation prevail.

I ask you to consider contributing to this Collection and I am grateful for your generosity. Together let us ask the Lord to bless us in all we do.

February Public Policy Summary by Jim Ercolano

Catholic social teaching on migrants, immigrants and refugees is in the Gospel of Matthew:

...the angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Rise, take the child and his mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I tell you. Herod is going to search for the child to destroy him" (Mt. 2: 13). While proclaiming the good news, Jesus was an itinerant, moving from place to place: ...the Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head (Mt. 8:20).

In 2003, the U.S. Bishops issued the pastoral letter, *Strangers No Longer: Together on the Journey of Hope*, that articulates five principles that govern how the Church responds to immigration policy proposals:

1. persons have right to find opportunities (for work) in their homeland.
2. persons have the right to migrate to support themselves and their families.
3. sovereign nations have a right to control their borders.
4. refugees and asylum seekers should be afforded protection.
5. the human rights and dignity of undocumented migrants should be respected.

Assisting more than half a million immigrants and refugees annually, Catholic Charities USA supports enactment of an immigration policy that:

- provide (a means to) lawful permanent residence/citizenship for undocumented persons.
- sustains and reunites families.
- promotes the security of the nation
- improves the economic prospects, health, labor protections, and stability of all
- creates greater legal avenues for necessary workers to enter the U.S.

As part of the New York Catholic Conference 2010 Legislative Agenda, under the subtitle "Welcome Immigrants and Migrants," are following legislative proposals:

- provide access to essential health, education, housing, employment, just compensation and social services for all New Yorkers, regardless of immigration status.
- protect the rights of migrant farmworkers and undocumented laborers and their families, including just compensation, benefits, services, protection from undue risks, and inclusion under appropriate state laws.
- increase access to adult English literacy programs.

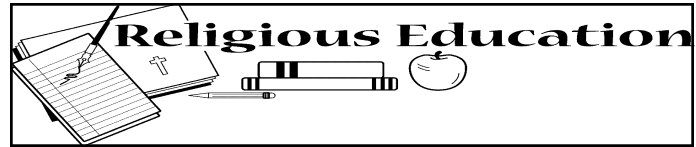

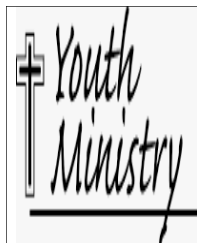

PASTORAL CARE NEWS

".. we cried to the Lord, the God of our fathers, and he heard our cry and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression."

+ In the first reading from Deuteronomy, Moses speaks to the Israelites about the importance of always remembering with gratitude God's saving action in rescuing them from their affliction and bringing them to the "Promised Land." *Do you call on the Lord in your distress? Do you believe he listens to you? Do you see signs of His saving presence?*

In Saint Paul's letter, he challenges the Romans to embrace and profess their faith with their whole heart. For us our faith needs to be spoken and lived out with certainty. *How determined are you to live out your faith in word and deed? Do you believe with all your heart that "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved"?*

Luke's gospel relates Jesus' struggle with Satan in the desert. Satan tested by asking Him to prove Himself, to abandon His Jewish faith by embracing worldly goods and power, and to demand a sign of the Father's love and care. By professing the Word of God, His faith in the Father's Kingdom and His complete trust in the Father's will, Jesus survived the tempter's attacks. *Have you asked the Holy Spirit to fill you with God's grace to resist the temptations of your life? Do you fully trust the Lord in all things? Do you speak out loud what your heart holds dear?*

In this first week of Lent reflect on how willing you are to live your life in service for the Lord. *Do you freely worship and praise Him as the Israelites did after their trek from Egypt to the Promised Land? Is your heart genuinely thankful for the gift of salvation or has it shriveled up like an arid desert? Will your Lenten journey begun in ashes lead to a desert blooming with life?*

Once again, Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Albany will prepare your 1040A or 1040EZ short forms free of charge. In order to use this service, your combined income must be less than \$39,000.00 and you must qualify to file the **1040A or 1040EZ** short forms.

PLEASE NOTE: We cannot prepare 1040 long forms with itemized deductions.

Tax preparation will be available in February at the Pastoral Center, 40 N. Main Ave, Albany NY 12203. **Appointments are required. Call 518-453-6650.**

You must bring the following items to your appointment:

- Original Social Security cards for self and dependents
- Last year’s tax return
- All W-2 forms
- All 1099 forms
- Voided check if you want to receive your refund through direct deposit
- Savings account routing number for direct deposit

Catholic Central High School Compiling Rich History

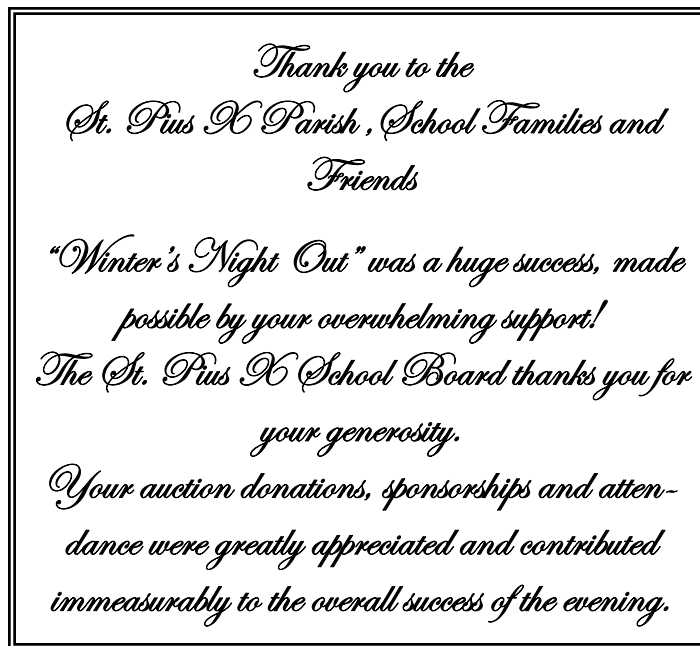

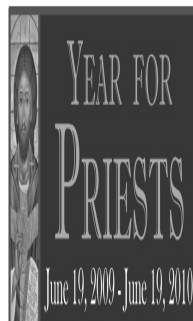
