Public Policy Summary Supplement by Jim Ercolano

If you want to make a difference, and visit your state senator or assembly person, your welcomed to attend the New York State Catholic Conference's 2010 Public Policy Day on Tuesday, March 9th, at the Empire State Plaza Convention Center in Albany. NYSCC is the official public policy voice of the Catholic Church in the Empire State. I first attended with my daughter Frances in 2004, and have returned ever since to share Catholic viewpoints on policy.

By attending, you would be joining with Archbishop Timothy Dolan, Bishop Howard Hubbard, and the Bishops of New York State to make our voices heard on important Catholic issues, including opposing abortion legislation, preserving Catholic schools, funding services for the poor, health care for the elderly and disabled, maternity and child care, and funding for re-entry programs for the formerly incarcerated.

There is no registration fee. Just go to www.nyscatholic.org/pages/policy/show_policy.asp. On that page, just fill out the form at the link provided. Workshop topics scheduled include a primer on Catholic social teaching and creating a parish public policy network. Many participants will meet with their legislators, and everyone will participate in Mass with the Bishops. Lunch will be provided at no cost to all registered attendees. Policy positions are summarized below:

Radical Abortion (Oppose the "Reproductive Health Act")
 The Bottom Line: The bill would ensure that abortions, possibly even "parial birth abortions," are legal throughout all 9 months of pregnancy. The bill could undermine conscience protection in current law by the state requiring religious entities to do or cover abortions. The bill seeks to make abortion virtually immune from state regulation or restriction.

Support for Poor Families (Maintain supports to enable low-income families to live in dignity)
 The Bottom Line: The budget cannot be balanced on the backs of those least able to make further sacrifices. Low income wage earners need education and training for skills in demand. Basic supports such as childcare, healthcare, transportation, affordable housing, and more public assistance for transitioning from welfare to work are needed.

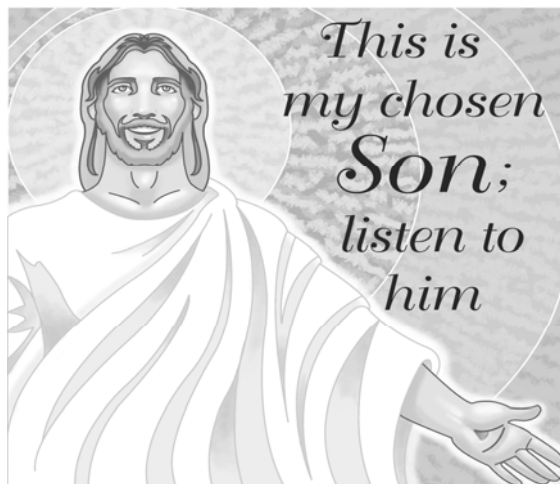
Preserving Catholic Schools (Access to Catholic Schools and Equity for All School Children)
 The Bottom Line: A total of \$243 million is owed to religious and independent schools, which amounts to \$500 for every student. lawmakers are urged to uphold their commitment to fully reimburse Catholic schools for mandated expenses and to provide parents, especially poorer parents, with a meaningful state education tax credit against rising costs.

Maternity and Child Care (Support the Maternity and Early Childhood Foundation, Inc.-MECF)

The Bottom Line: MECF, a private foundation, funds programs that provide critical services to young low-income pregnant and parenting women to promote prenatal care, optimal child health and positive parenting skills. After 25 years of cost effective service, the proposed 2010-2011 Executive Budget proposes to eliminate all state funding.

Community Re-entry (Support Successful Post Incarceration Community Re-entry)

The Bottom Line: When returning to the community, formerly incarcerated individuals have a difficult time finding and keeping employment. Providing these men and women with education programs, job training, and treatment programs are much more cost effective (for most who are amenable to treatment), than repeated crime and more incarceration.



ALL ABOUT CHANGE

On this Second Sunday of Lent the scriptures remind us that when we have an encounter with our God, things are bound to change. In the first reading God tells Abram to raise his eyes to the sky, promising descendants as numerous as the stars. Abram's act of faith in the Lord is sealed in covenant, forever changing the course of salvation history. In the Gospel story of the Transfiguration, always proclaimed on this Lenten Sunday, the Lord Jesus changes in appearance before the eyes of the apostles who, like Abram, raise their eyes to the spectacle in the sky. It is Saint Paul who brings it all together for us: "He will change our lowly body to conform with his glorified body" (Philippians 3:21). Lent is all about change, all about conversion. Let us cast our own eyes to heaven, awaiting that day when we will be changed—when we will share in Christ's glory.

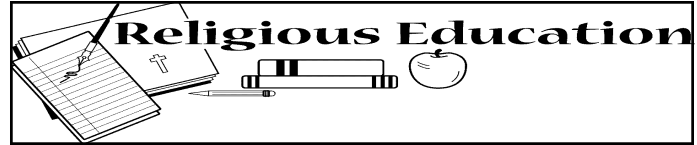

"...our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we also await a savior, the Lord Jesus Christ. He will change our lowly body by the power that enables him also to bring all things into subjection to himself."

+ The first reading from Genesis reveals the heart of Abram, a man of faith, who trusts in the promises of God and yet asks for a guarantee that the promises will be fulfilled. It narrates the consummation of the Lord's covenant with Abram through an elaborate ritual that reassures Abram's inner spirit. *Do you believe in the promises of the Lord? How has the Lord reassured your inner spirit?*

St. Paul in his letter reminds the Philippians that they were made for heaven, that the Lord has promised them eternal life. He urges them to be faithful disciples imitating the virtues he has tried to uphold, and preparing themselves for Christ's kingdom. *This Lent how are you preparing yourself for the heavenly kingdom? Where do you struggle and waver? Why not ask for the Lord for help!*

Luke's gospel relates the inspiring mountain top experience of the Transfiguration. Jesus, revealed in all His glory, readies Himself to trade His divine glory for the mission of the suffering servant so that God's promises may all be fulfilled and we might inherit eternal life. *Do you recognize the generous gift of grace Christ willingly gives to us? Do you accept the sacrificial offering He bore to give us eternal life? How willing are you, as a disciple to sacrifice for another to imitate Christ?*

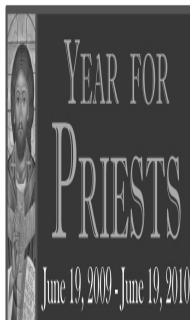
