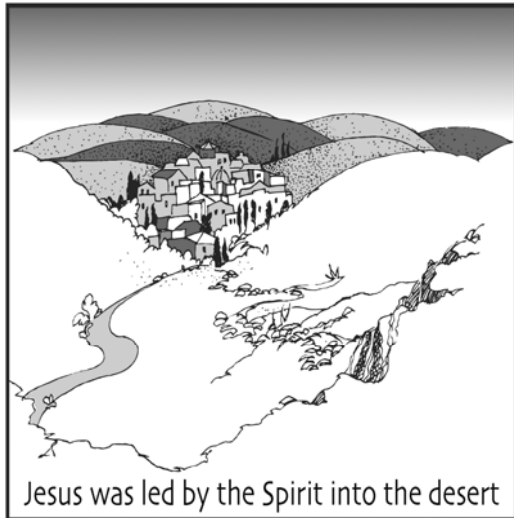

THE RESPONSE OF CHRIST

We commonly call today’s Gospel “The Temptation in the Desert” but it more accurately might be called “The Triumph in the Desert.” The Gospels are filled with stories in which Jesus is triumphant, in which he faces evil, enemies, adversity. All of these prey on his human nature and seek to make him cease breathing with the spirit of God’s will. But each time Jesus prevails, and in prevailing gives glory to God. Each of these triumphs is a small prefiguring of the Resurrection. And it is the Resurrection for which Lent prepares us. It is a time when we remember that the very breath of Christ, bestowed on his followers after his resurrection, was also bestowed on us by the Spirit of baptism. It is that Spirit, that baptismal breath of Christ, that we must draw upon to strengthen us in our trials, that our temptations will be vanquished by the will of God. In our failings remembered, we ask forgiveness. In our triumphs through Christ, we give glory to God.

This Weekend the second collection is the annual **Black, Native American and Latin American Collection**. This annual collection, established by the Church in 1885, advances the Church’s mission of evangelization and of compassionate response to the plight of some of the neediest people in our country and in Latin America. The purpose of this annual appeal is to assist dioceses unable to support missionaries in their ministry on behalf of African -American and Native American people in the mission areas in which such economic hardship and deprivation prevail.

I ask you to consider contributing to this Collection and I am grateful for your generosity. Together let us ask the Lord to bless us in all we do.

Parish Lenten Retreat

Our Lenten Retreat “Praying with St. Ignatius” will begin this Monday, March 2nd at 7PM in the chapel. This program will run for the Mondays of Lent ending on Easter Monday. “Praying with St. Ignatius” is an 18th Annotation Retreat based on the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius Loyola. Each meeting will run for an hour to an hour and a half. Each meeting will include some discussion, teaching about different methods of prayer and discernment and sharing of our prayer experiences. Rather than give something up for Lent maybe you want to make an effort to deepen your relationship with God.

Fasting Together for Lent

Fasting may be a priority on your Lenten spring regime. Almost every religious tradition recognizes that fasting is a key to heightened spiritual awareness. You may know this from your own experience. When you are engaged in a hobby, painting a room, keeping vigil near a delivery room, or standing watch at a sickbed, you may simply forget to eat. What you are doing so fills you that the intensity of the action is itself nourishing. In fasting from food, or drink, or habitual behaviors, you make room for what is truly important.

Even though Lenten Sundays stand apart from the Lenten fast, you will notice traces of fasting in our liturgy. We fast from singing the Gloria and Alleluia, we fast from flowers bedecking the altar, and there may be a noticeable drop in the number of infant baptisms as parents elect to wait until Easter. This hints that fasting is a prelude to feasting, and the vigor of our Easter alleluias is rich fare after a long silence. In the same way, even a small fast—no cream in the coffee, no pepper in the soup, no radio in the car—can not only point to deeper hungers, but help us rejoice more fully in the feast when we break our fast together.

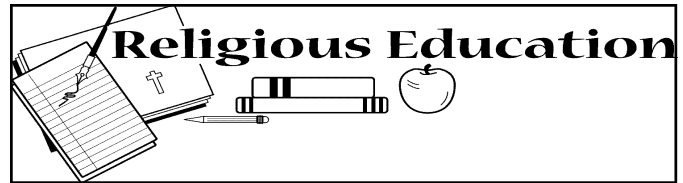
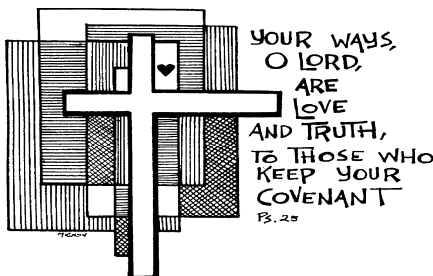

PASTORAL CARE NEWS

"This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."

+ In the first reading, the Genesis narrative of God's covenant relationship with Noah portrays a loving God who preserves and extends His love to "every living creature." In spite of the great flood and the devastation it brought to the earth, there is a blessing to come. As evil is swallowed up by the sea mankind is offered an opportunity to start anew. Once again the scriptures proclaim the promise fulfilled in Jesus. *What sinful tendencies would you like the Lord to wash away for you this Lent? What evils of our world need to be swallowed up by God's grace? Could we solve some of the world's problems with a flood of God's love flowing through us?*

In his letter St. Peter appeals to all Christians to remain faithful to Jesus even during trials and difficulties. He reminds his readers that Jesus suffered for sins so that he might lead us to God. Our baptism is our appeal to God for this salvation and a sign of our covenant to live out His new life in the Spirit. *Since Jesus washes away your sinful deeds how do you plan to live differently? What kindnesses will replace your evil tendencies? How will you live out this new life?*

In Mark's gospel, Jesus, having received the Spirit, experienced profound temptation. Yet he did not yield. He found His strength in the scriptures and prayer. *When you are tempted do you seek Christ strength in the here and now? Do you look to Him for help in Eucharist and through gospel meditation? Have you made prayer a new way to live your life in the Spirit?*

Seek wholeness through Christ
And find His strength through prayer and in
gospel living.**

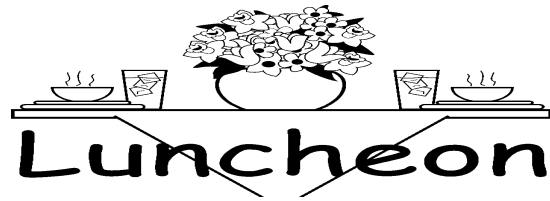

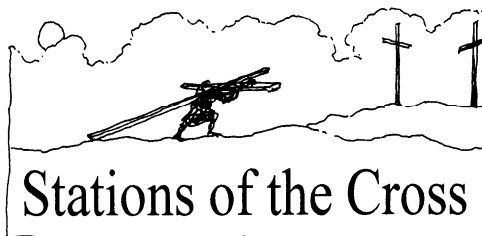
