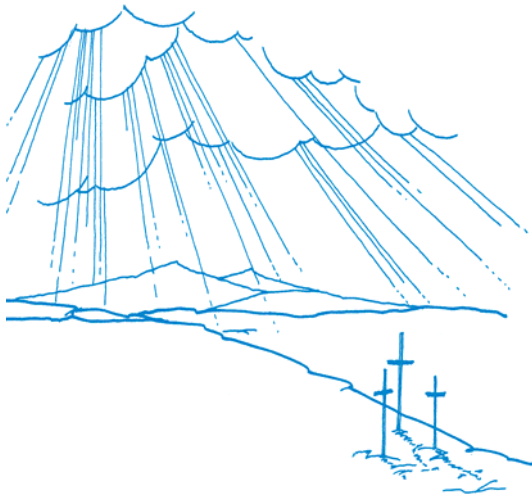

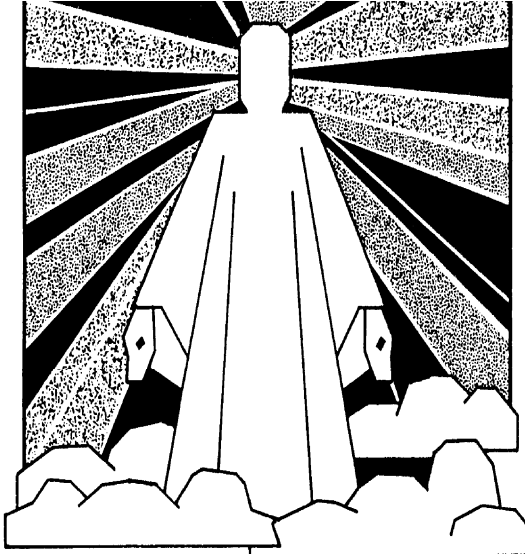

TEMPTED BY TRANSFIGURATION

Jesus faces a different sort of temptation in today’s Gospel. Peter (whom Jesus would refer to as “Satan” in their encounter at Caesarea Philippi) tempts him to stay on the mountain of the Transfiguration, residing in a tent of glory with Moses and Elijah, as the Ark of the Covenant had dwelt in a tent of glory among the people of Israel. Jesus doesn’t succumb, but makes Peter and his other followers come down with him off their mountain of glory to continue their ministry of proclaiming the reign of God. Jesus turned down the glory and power offered to him in last week’s temptation passage; he likewise turns it down again, even when it seems to portray him as the fulfillment of Israel’s messianic expectations. Yet, in a way, Jesus did allow himself to be tempted by transfiguring moments in his public ministry when he faced illness, demons, disbelief, hypocrites. He allowed each of these moments to transfigure the world around him more and more into the image of God’s reign. They also each transfigured him a bit more on his road to Jerusalem, Calvary, the tomb, and his everlasting transfiguration in resurrection.

The words “disciple” and “discipline” are very close relatives. People in various walks of life know that our personal transfigurations frequently happen only when we encounter times of trial. Those in recovery know that ongoing encounters with temptations are sources of growth and strength. And so it is for us as faithful disciples renewing our lives through Lenten disciplines. We need to turn aside from the allure of the temptations of self-centeredness, greed, and unhealthy appetites as we increase the presence of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving in our lives. Daily, most of us confront a “demon,” an illness in body, mind, or spirit, whether in ourselves or in the world. With Christ, we are called upon to confront its presence in ourselves or others, and like Christ, find our true and lasting transfiguration by growing in obedience to the Father’s will. By God’s grace we will one day come to live in the everlasting glory of the Resurrection that we also share.

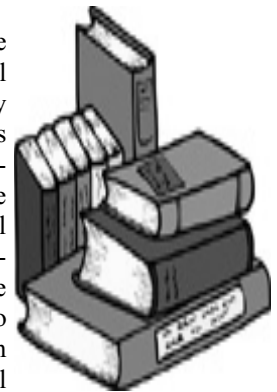
INVITATION TO ATTEND EASTER MASS TAPING

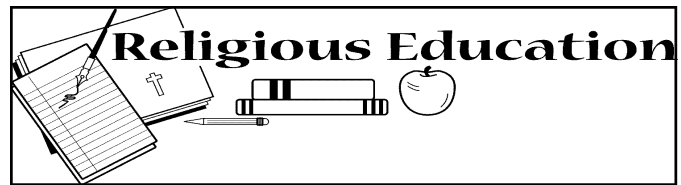

PASTORAL CARE NEWS

"If God is for us, who can be against us?"

+ In the first reading from Genesis Abraham's faith and trust in God is tested. When asked to give up his precious son, Isaac, he never appears to question God's will. Committed to serving the Lord, he arrives in Moriah to find his faithfulness rewarded by a sacrificial ram and abundant blessings promised for his descendants. *Do you trust God even during the most difficult and demanding times? Will your faith pass such a test? Or has your faith been tested so? Did you find a blessing on the other side?*

St. Paul recognized that the Christians in Rome were experiencing a testing of their faith. With downright persecution and harassment for their beliefs by their community and the ruling political powers, they wondered if God had abandoned them. In his letter he encourages them to rely deeply on their relationship with Jesus and the unfathomable love of Christ as He suffered, died and rose for them. He proclaims a freedom secured by our loving God so all can endure all through Jesus. *When worry and fear test your faith, how do you respond? When trials overwhelm you, do you feel abandoned by God? Do you call out to the Source of all loving responses and trust in Him?*

In Mark's gospel narrative of the Transfiguration, the disciples learn a valuable lesson of faith. Having experienced the glorious presence of God on the mountaintop they are called to follow His way of suffering and sacrificial love. It is not an easy journey but they must trust that the blessings far outweigh the cost. *Do you know the dazzling presence of God? Are you willing to follow Jesus and live your faith whatever the cost?*

Take heart! If Abraham and the early Christians could do it, so can you! Trust in the Lord. He will never abandon you.

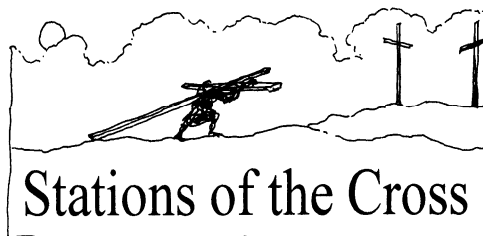
