“That they may learn to know Christ, who came to save what was lost”.

As we continue our Lenten journey toward Easter’s glory, we come today to the Third Sunday of Lent. It is on this Sunday that we enter into what is known as the First Scrutiny.

For those who are preparing to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church through our RCIA process, it is a significant milestone in the Rite for our Catechumens.

Two weeks ago on the First Sunday of Lent, we, as a parish family of faith prayed for and supported our Candidates and Catechumens in the “Rite of Sending” as we commended them to the Bishop for the “Rite of Election and Recognition”. This Sunday and each of the next two Sundays, one of the Three Scrutinies will be celebrated.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) describes the Scrutinies as “rites for self-searching and repentance, and have, above all, a spiritual purpose. The Scrutinies are meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong and good”. It is meant to be a time of purification and enlightenment. They are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth and the life.

Many liturgies use specific scripture readings to illuminate the meaning of each of these Three Scrutinies. All of them build upon each other to widen the focus of the entire process.

The First Scrutiny offers to the elect and to all of us, an invitation to know Jesus, the Christ. We are called to search for Christ. Who is He? How do we know Him? How can He change our lives and our hearts?

These are not just questions for the Catechumens, but for all of us as faithful followers of Christ. As we journey together this Lent, let us all go through these exercises with the elect as we live out our Baptismal promise to support them as they seek Christ with the finest reaches of their spirit.

INVITATION TO ATTEND EASTER MASS TAPING

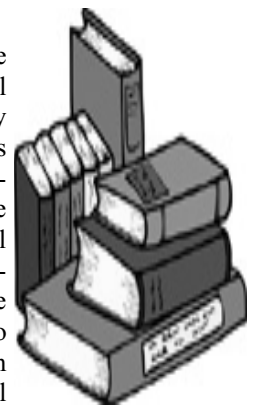

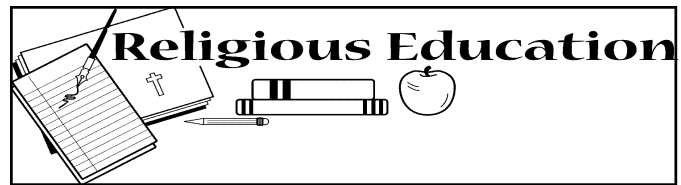

+ In the first reading Exodus narrates the commandments delivered to Moses on Mount Sinai to deepen God’s covenant with the Israelites. Here, the Father guides them in their response to His unconditional love and gift of freedom. His demands give them a spiritual freedom to grow in holiness. *Are you burdened by bad habits and sin? Isn’t it time to embrace His disciplines to fine-tune your heart?*

St. Paul writes to the Corinthians that Christ’s power and wisdom are the tools Christians need for spiritual integrity. *Where do you look for wisdom and strength? Do you seek the advice of others before looking to Christ, His sacrificial cross, and his way to wisdom and strength?* He’ll guide you to true wisdom and give you the courage to do the right thing.

In John’s gospel we hear a familiar story. Jesus caused quite a commotion as He overturned tables, driving birds and animals, and moneychangers alike from the temple. He could not bear to see His Father’s house being so abused. *What things disturb your sense of Christian integrity and justice? What are you passionate about? Are you willing to take the risk and work toward change?* The Lord has set you free to seek His excellence, holiness, and goodness. *As His child, do you take your freedom seriously?*

Are you looking to the market place to solve the troubles of the world? Overturn the tables through authentic prayer and worship.

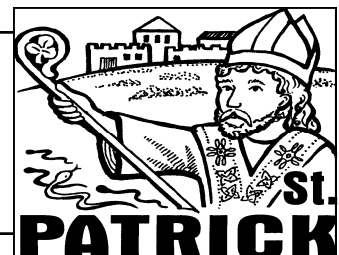

THEY ALL CAME BACK

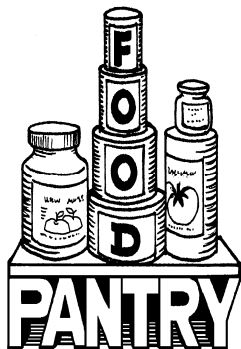
