**Purification and Enlightenment**

The Rite of Christian Initiation is based on the principle that the process of conversion proceeds gradually, in stages. Progress from one stage to the next is marked by a liturgical celebration in the midst of the parish community.

The third stage is the period of purification and enlightenment and coincides with Lent. During this time the elect (formerly the catechumens) and the candidates enter into a period of intense preparation and prayer which includes the three public celebrations of the scrutinies and is marked by the presentations of the Creed and the Lord's Prayer. The Rite of Election and the Call to Continuing Conversion have already taken place and are celebrated at the beginning of this stage. This period ends with the celebration of baptism, confirmation, and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. It should be noted that only the elect are baptized. All the groups are confirmed and welcomed to the table.

**INVITATION TO ATTEND EASTER MASS TAPING**

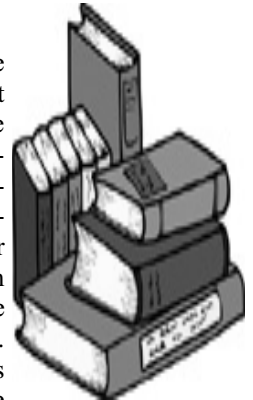

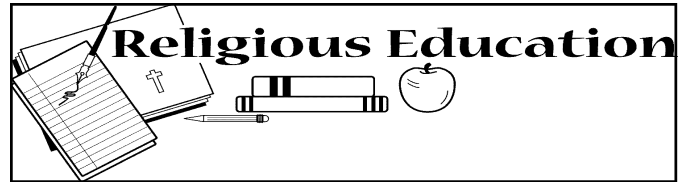

*“And this is the verdict, that the light came into the world but people preferred darkness to light, because their works were evil... But whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God.”*

+ Today's readings reveal God's mercy and loving faithfulness.

In Chronicles, the infidelity and sinfulness of the people of Judah is exposed. The Lord warns His people that they must change, having King Cyrus call them back and rebuild His kingdom. *Do you have the courage to ask the Lord to expose your sinfulness, this Lent?*

In St. Paul's letter, the Ephesians are challenged to look to God's mercy, great love and immeasurable grace extended to them even when they were “dead” in their transgressions. They have the gift of salvation so that they might live in Christ. *What good works has Christ called you to in order for you to live out your salvation? How are you responding?*

In John's gospel, Jesus reveals to Nicodemus the real meaning of this gift of salvation. Jesus describes, in His own words, Himself as a sacred gift of God and His mission to give eternal life. Somehow Nicodemus needed the protection of the night and quiet secretive presence of Jesus to let these words and God's grace seep in. *When are you most open to listening to God? Do you hear Him say I love you? Be open! He is there!*

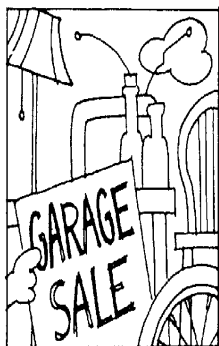

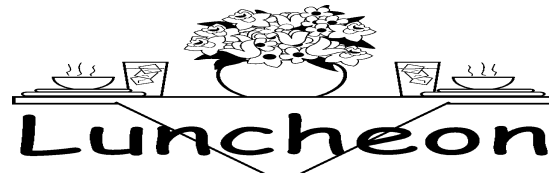

**COMMUNAL RESPONSIBILITY**

The people of God forgot the covenant and flouted God's laws. They did not listen to the prophets among them, who spoke for God in warning them. We are reminded by these readings that we will be judged as a people, not just as individuals.
