Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

BECOMING OBEDIENT . . .

The words of the prophet Isaiah ring out with great clarity about the suffering of God's anointed One: "Morning after morning he opens my ear that I may hear; and I have not rebelled" (Isaiah 50:4, 5). To "obey" means to listen and to heed. Jesus, the Suffering Servant of Isaiah, sets his face "like flint, knowing that he shall not be put to shame" (Isaiah 50:7b). Relying on God, attentive and obedient to what he has heard, he submits to the worst that human beings can endure.

TO THE POINT OF DEATH

Jesus' obedience, his listening to God's voice in his life, led to prophetic deeds and finally to his death. His humility consisted not in grasping at equality with God, but embracing human life in all its fullness, including death. There is nothing human that Jesus did not share with us except sin. Pain, suffering, joy, laughter, humiliation, and sorrow: he willingly accepted all of these in order to be one with us and to make us one with God, as he was one with God. He listened to the voice of God and followed its lead, no matter what.

In his total abandonment of his life to God, he became for us Savior and Redeemer. He showed us how to live and how to die, one with the God who loves us. This is not "blind faith," but it's not always clear, either, in its particulars. We don't always see clearly the way in which we are to walk, but nevertheless trust God's fidelity to lead us forward. We are invited to follow, and to acknowledge "that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father" (Philippians 2:11).

About The Palm Sunday Crosses....

Palm Crosses are not only an aid to our observance of Palm Sunday, these particular crosses are a way for us to help support self-help programs and community projects in East Africa.

The crosses are imported by a volunteer-run program of fellow Christians in this country. All of their net proceeds and any donations are returned to East Africa in the form of non-denominational grants. These grants have enriched the lives of hundreds of Africans who desperately need assistance, encouragement and hope for a better tomorrow.

Projects supported through the palm crosses include agricultural and vocational training schools, safe community water systems and emergency relief for victims of civil strife, drought and other disasters. Over time, total grants from African palms have exceeded \$1,000,000.

The crosses are made throughout the year in seven mud villages in Tanzania, often involving whole families in the process. Tanzanian workers who make the crosses are paid generous wages for their labor.

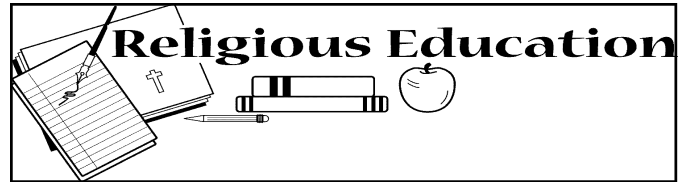

PASTORAL CARE NEWS

“Go into the village opposite you, and immediately on entering it, you will find a colt tethered on which no one has ever sat. Untie it and bring it here.”

+ With this procession narrative Mark begins to tell of the last days of Jesus and the relationships He has with His disciples. Their intimate and trusting relationship with Him led them to obediently follow His instructions during the good times. But their fear of conflict, suffering and death caused them to flee *“when the going got tough”*. This is so evident in the solemn proclamation of the Passion of Jesus later in Mark’s gospel. *How is your relationship with the Lord influenced by the events in your life? Do you listen to the inner voice of God, and obediently follow His directives? When you offer adoration and praise is it fleeting like the cries of “hosanna” at the gates of Jerusalem? Does your life fail to reveal any true commitment to Christ?*

The prophet Isaiah describes in his servant song the mission of the faithful servant of God. He is resigned to his mission and the sufferings he must endure to fulfill God’s will. In his letter to the Philippians, St Paul proclaims that the sufferings of Jesus, (as proclaimed in the Passion narrative), confirm that Jesus is indeed the suffering servant described in Isaiah’s prophetic word. He was completely obedient to the Father’s will in spite of His divinity. In humble obedience, he suffered all for us. His spirit of love compelled Him to the cross. *Are you as passionate about loving others?*

**Look to Christ in His vulnerable state,
As He reveals who He really is.
Accept His loving sacrifice
And receive His Spirit to give
Whatever the cost.**

Parish Survey Update

During 2008, all St. Pius X parishioners were asked to participate in a survey that the Parish Pastoral Council initiated and the Siena Research Institute (SRI) conducted. Fifty-one percent (1,220) of the registered members of St. Pius X Church responded to the survey. SRI staff reported its findings to the parish council late in 2008, and those results were then passed on to parishioners. (The final report document is available on the parish web site at http://www.stpiusxloudonville.org/Survey_report.pdf) Parish leadership is listening to you, and this update is intended to communicate the actions we have been taking in response to your thoughts and comments.

Since the survey results were made available, a number of parishioners have been working with the members of the parish council to go over the survey report, and to review the more than six hundred individual comments that parishioners provided with their completed surveys. This work is being coordinated by several of the council's standing committees: Adult Faith Formation; Buildings and Grounds; Christian Works and Service; Hospitality; Prayer and Worship; Ministry; and Welcoming.

At the March parish council meeting, each of these committees provided a status report on their follow-up work pertaining to the parish survey. Much has been done since the first of the year, but more work remains. At this point, it is still too soon to tell you what specific conclusions and actions will be taken. The council expects to begin reporting details to you within a few months.

It is clear from the work that has been done so far, that the council will take action in at least these two general areas:

- define ways to reach out to the people who are included on the list of registered parishioners, but who did not respond to the survey. A number of these people may have moved out of the area, changed parishes, etc., but if there is any person or family who is no longer attending Mass at St. Pius for any other reason, we want to identify that person or family, and warmly invite them back to the Eucharist as an active member of our parish family.
- improve communication to parishioners about the many ministries, programs, services and activities that are available in the parish, as well as about the liturgies that are offered at St. Pius X. Several of your comments made it clear that we are not effectively communicating a number of programs, services, etc. that already exist in our parish. As a result, the council wants to provide catechesis/education where necessary, and also improve communication to all parishioners.

Rest assured that work continues on evaluating your input to the parish survey, and on determining the best ways to respond to what you, the parishioners of St. Pius X, had to say, so that we can all make St. Pius X a great place to meet and worship.
