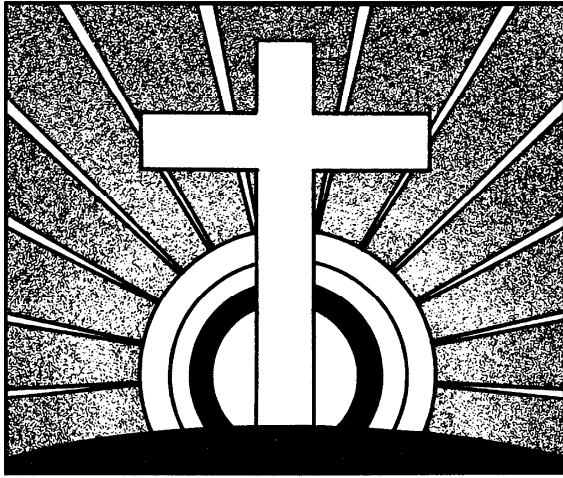

Live as Witnesses to the Risen Lord

BELIEVING IN JESUS CHRIST

Throughout the Easter season, all three of the Sunday readings are taken from the New Testament—the Christian scriptures. Together they explore what it means to believe in Jesus as the Christ, the One who fulfilled the prophecies of the Jewish scriptures.

Today’s selections refer to our human weakness, yet they emphasize the forgiveness and peace that are available to those who put their faith in “Jesus Christ the righteous one” (1 John 2:2). In the Acts of the Apostles Peter invites everyone to “repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away” (Acts 3:19). The First Letter of John calls Jesus Christ “expiation for our sins” (1 John 2:2). Finally, in the Gospel Jesus greets the disciples with “Peace” and urges them to preach “repentance, for the forgiveness of sins” (Luke 24:47).

The Easter season gives us many opportunities to remember the totality of what God has done for us. Today, two weeks after Easter, the scripture writers urge us to remember the whole event of the paschal mystery—Christ’s passion, death, and resurrection. This is important because every one of us who is baptized has a share in that mystery. We are constantly called to die to sin and rise to renewed life in Christ Jesus.

The following article was reprinted from Catholic.net and also appears on our diocesan website as a link on the vocations page. During this year of the priest, let us join in prayer with our brothers and sisters around the world for an increase in vocations.

Year of the Priest

ROME — Holy Thursday is a day dedicated to the priesthood. How about a whole year? Hoping to reinvigorate the priesthood, Pope Benedict XVI announced a Jubilee Year of the Priest beginning June 19, 2009. During a March 16 plenary assembly with members of the Congregation for the Clergy, the Pope called for the event to mark the 150th anniversary of the death of St. John Vianney, the Curé of Ars, and for the “spiritual perfection” of the Church’s priests. St. John Vianney died on Aug. 4, 1859. “The missionary dimension of a priest arises from his sacramental configuration to Christ the head,” said the Pope, highlighting the “indispensable struggle for moral perfection which must dwell in every truly priestly heart.” “The ecclesial, communal, hierarchical and doctrinal dimension is absolutely indispensable for any authentic mission, and this alone guarantees its spiritual effectiveness,” said Pope Benedict, adding that priests must be “present, identifiable and recognizable — for their judgment of faith, personal virtues and attire — in the fields of culture and of charity, which have always been at the heart of the Church’s mission.” “The announcement was a great surprise,” admitted Father Jim Steffes, executive director of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops’ Secretariat of Clergy, Consecrated Life and Vocations. Father Steffes hopes the year will help renew the priesthood.

Patron of Priests

In highlighting the Year of the Priest, Pope Benedict called upon the example of St. John Vianney. The humble French diocesan priest was assigned to the rural and spiritually dying town of Ars France. Through his example of personal holiness and attention to the sacraments, St. John was able to transform his parish. Pilgrims from all over the world came to receive the sacrament of reconciliation from the Curé of Ars, as he became known.

“He is not really well known,” said Father Cihak. “Most parish priests know very little about their patron.”

“In the New Evangelization, we need a renewal of parish life, and that means a renewal of the parish priesthood,” said Father Cihak. “St. Vianney is helpful for that because he shows us the parish priesthood is not so much about programs, but about personal holiness and personal witness.

“When you look at St. John Vianney, you don’t see a charismatic, talented sort of individual, but a humble man who knew what it means to get close to Christ — through confession, Mass, personal prayer and works of mercy. He took a fallow parish and made it a hotbed of holiness in about 10 years.”

Father Steffes agreed. “He was a simple man who opened himself up to the will of the Father,” said Father Steffes.

In describing the saint, Father Cihak noted similarities between St. John and the Italian St. Pio of Pietrelcina.

“They both saw the importance of confession, and both had explicit battles with Satan,” said Father Cihak. “The parish priest’s battle against Satan cannot be overlooked. He does this through his priestly ministry, especially confession, where he is pulling souls out of the kingdom of darkness, and also as a spiritual father protecting his flock from evil.”

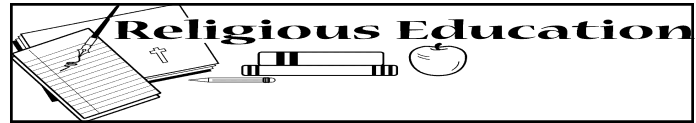

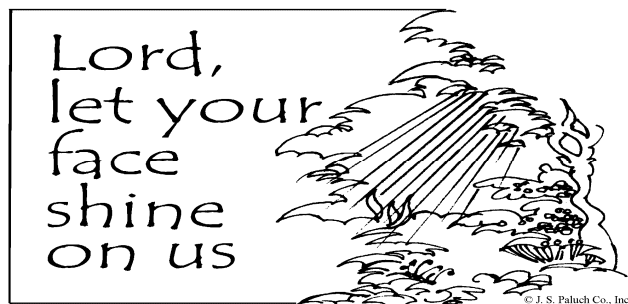

St. John's letter urges his community to follow Christ's way. As they become united to the triune God, His love will be made perfect in them. *Have you compromised worldly values for Christian values? Will you let the Holy Spirit perfect Christ's love within you? Change our hearts, O Lord!*

Luke's gospel recounts Jesus' Resurrection visits with the disciples. Imprisoned by their worries, attitudes, and beliefs, He transforms the disciples fear to peace, by opening their minds to know and understand the truth about Him. *What beliefs have entrapped you in fear? Have you asked our Resurrected Lord to open your mind more completely to Him and the truth? Change our minds, O Lord!*

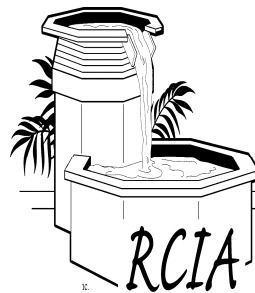

We know anger is expressed in many different forms. Some are explosive and deadly. Others, such as cardiovascular problems or high blood pressure, are often quiet and unseen. We also know many of us have trouble with anger and how to handle it. That is what this course is about. We are going to look at some of the causes of anger, such as being physically abused, treated unjustly or being manipulated, then examine our thoughts and beliefs to see if they increase or decrease the anger we feel. We will look at the differences between being aggressive and being assertive and, learn to ask for what is needed with strength and dignity. The Four A's of anger, "awareness, acceptance, analysis and appropriate action," will be discussed for increased clarity and understanding. We will work on problems we are currently facing, attempt to deal with anger realistically, and seek to find effective solutions to real and current situations.

FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER**

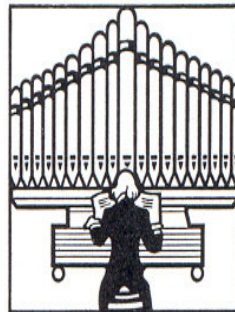
First Reading: Acts 4:8-12
