From the Pastor's Desk

The recently concluded pastoral planning initiative entitled Called to BE Church has resulted in a number of plans for the future our Church in the Diocese of Albany. For the six parishes in our planning cluster (St. Clare; Our Lady of Mercy; St. Francis de Sales; St. Pius X; St. Ambrose and Our Lady of the Assumption) the plans call for more collaboration and cooperation. In the instance of Our Lady of Mercy and St. Francis deSales, a planning process using outside consultants, engaged by these two parishes, has been initiated with the aim of them becoming one Catholic faith community. This is, as you can imagine, a difficult endeavor, with many hurdles to overcome but also many graced moments which these two faith communities are embracing. We keep them in our prayers in a special way.

At a recent Called to BE Church follow-up meeting it was decided to establish a coordinating committee to oversee what we, as the Catholic community in Colonie, would do to advance the mission and ministry of the Lord. Various sub-committees will be working on different dimensions of parish life and ministry in our collective parishes. Prayer and Worship, Faith Formation, Christian Service and Administration are the major areas that will receive further attention.

In parts of our diocese, especially in the urban areas, there have been consolidations, mergers and closings of parishes. Parishioners from those parishes are beginning to find and establish themselves in new spiritual homes. In a special way we need to pray for these sisters and brothers who in some instances are leaving a cherished parish with a long and noble history.

In recent weeks a few new families have been coming to St. Pius X parish and we welcome them with open arms. They remind us that as much as we love our parish communities and our parish churches, our faith is rooted fundamentally in Jesus Christ and He lives in every parish community. It is His Eucharist that is celebrated whether that celebration takes place in a magnificent church or a tent. We receive the Body and Blood of Jesus whether it is administered to us in the English language, Spanish, Italian, French, German, or any other language. And so we say WELCOME to one and all who wish to bless our parish with their faith, their presence and their prayers.

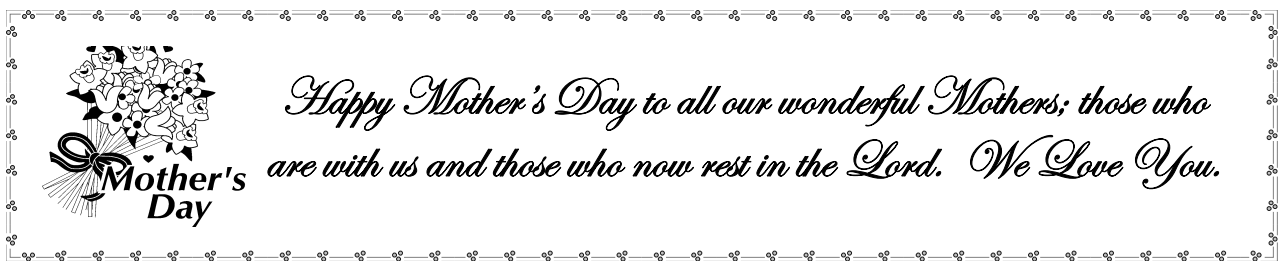


LIVING BRANCHES

The Gospel and second reading for this Fifth Sunday of Easter emphasize the need for us to remain in Christ, and he in us. This shared life finds expression in the image of the one vine and many branches. We become living branches of the vine, members of the Body of Christ through baptism, Eucharist, and confirmation, sacraments of sharing God's own life. The First Letter of John describes the fruit of this vine as active love of neighbor: "And his commandment is this: we should believe . . . and love one another" (1 John 3:23).

Our first reading from Acts shows us an example of someone who shares in Christ's life in the person of Saint Paul. Paul's fearless witness, even at the risk of his life, is proof to everyone that the risen Lord's Spirit truly fills him with life and is bearing fruit in him.

Our own faith lives may be like this. Even when we try to nourish and tend our spiritual lives, we often experience only a few "blooms." The metaphor Jesus used, the vine and the branches, is a beautiful image and says much about persistence in the faith for today's believer. Sometimes our conversion experiences are slow in coming, and take lots of time and tending. As long as we keep our attention focused on the Lord, there is always hope that deep faith and conversion will blossom within and around us. The words of the Lord that continue to encourage us are embedded within today's Gospel passage: "Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing" (John 15:5).

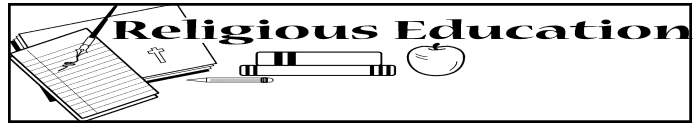

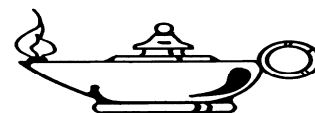

PASTORAL CARE NEWS

"The church throughout all Judea, Galilee, and Samaria was at peace. It was being built up and walked in the fear of the Lord, and with the consolation of the Holy Spirit it grew in numbers."

+ In the reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we have an opportunity to reflect on the tension within the early church. Paul's integrity and trustworthiness was challenged in spite of his proclaimed conversion. Yet the early Christians and the leadership ultimately found peace as they rooted their trust in the Lord and the workings of the Holy Spirit.

In the church today we can easily find sources of tension as well, among those who are more conservative, liberal, those who love tradition and those who like to experiment with new and creative approaches or models. It may be as simple as having different musical preferences or as difficult as great struggles with theological perspectives. *When these differences occur how do you respond? Do you turn to the Lord with trust? Do you let the Spirit have His way? Or do you try to push your point of view, never listening to the other person's spiritual perspective?*

John's letter reminds the community that God, Who is greater than each of us, knows truth. It is our job to remain connected to Christ, and His Spirit. Then we need not fear that God will abandon us, or we, as church, will travel down a path away from Christ. *In what ways do you try to remain connected to God? What distracts you from this priority? What changes do you need to make?*

In John's gospel Jesus drives the point home with the marvelous images of vine, branches, vine grower, and pruning. On this Sunday we often have focused on our individual need to increase our prayer time with the Lord. Maybe we sensed our need for pruning to produce more fruit for the Lord. Whatever the case we focused on individual change.

This year there are many changes happening within church communities. There are struggles and tension. Pruning is happening and being planned in today's church. It is for new growth and to create of all of us a much healthier church. It is the Father's doing, as vine grower. It is the Spirit's move. It is our call to continually trust in the Lord and do our part.

"Remain in me, as I remain in you."

Let the Spirit lead.

His peace resides inside our heart!

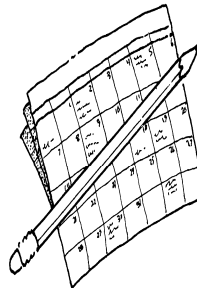

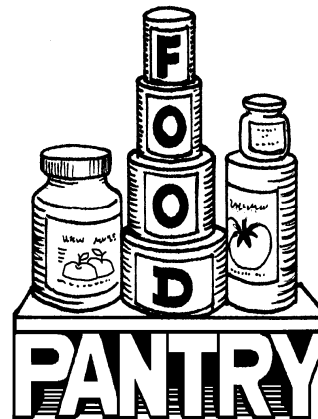

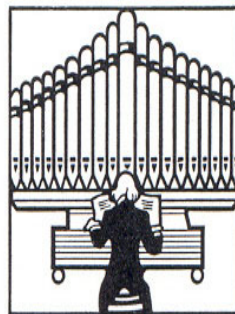
