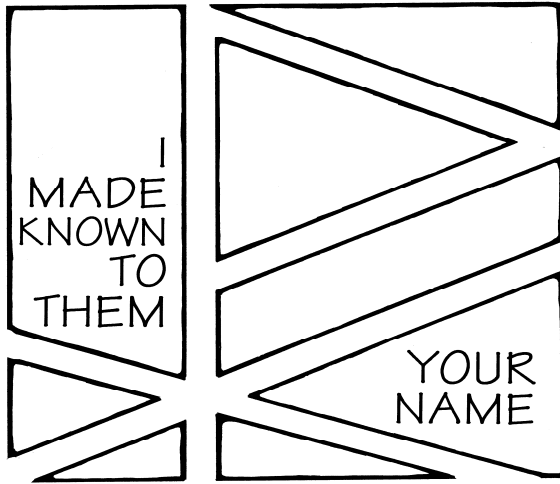

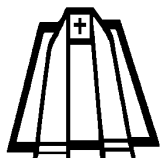

WORTHY WITNESSES

It may seem odd that, so soon after celebrating Jesus' glorious ascension into heaven, we hear the gruesome tale of Stephen's martyrdom. But even in our most celebratory times, Christianity is a faith that always recalls the difficulties of living the will of God in the world. That is why the Church places Stephen's feast day, December 26, immediately after our celebration of the birth of Christ. In the rhythm of today's readings, the account of Stephen's martyrdom is a reminder that, with Christ ascended into heaven, the mission of giving witness to him—including his suffering and death—falls to those who have been baptized into the Holy Spirit and bear his name. In his final moment, Stephen shows himself a true namesake of Jesus, as he echoes the words of forgiveness spoken from the cross. The prayer we hear Jesus offer in today's Gospel was also a prayer for Stephen, who came to believe in Jesus through the word of the apostles. No matter what fate life holds for us, we always have this consolation of our Easter faith: Christ has prayed to the Father on our behalf. Let us, like Stephen, be worthy witnesses to our name "Christian."

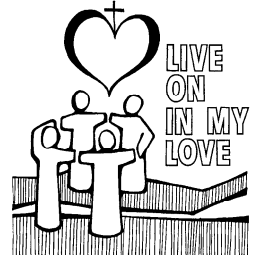

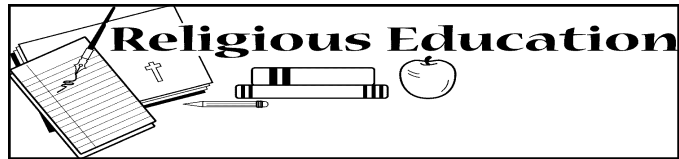

## PASTORAL CARE NEWS

*“Holy Father, I pray not only for them, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, ...”*

+ In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, Stephen, empowered by the Holy Spirit, gives his life for Christ. As he witnesses his faith he is consoled by a vision of Christ in His glory. *How willing are you to give your life for your faith?* Consider how many ways you compromise your faith each day, before answering this question. Today the Holy Spirit is calling each of us to witness our faith. We have opportunities to embrace many little “deaths” for the love of Christ. Why worry what others think of you! It is for Jesus you are to live.

John’s vision in Revelations continues in the second reading. Jesus proclaims, *“Behold I am coming soon.”* These words of comfort and hope speak to the church, evangelized by Stephen and the apostles, as it faced many hardships and endured persecution. *When crises, worries, and problems overwhelm you what are the words of the Lord that comfort you and give you hope?*

John’s gospel expresses Jesus’ concern for all of us as we follow in His footsteps. It records Jesus’ priestly prayer for all of us. *How did you feel when you heard Jesus’ prayer for you and me? Do you see yourself as a gift from the Father to Jesus Christ? Are you willing to live for Jesus?*
