ST. AGNES
CEMETERY**
A Tradition of Faith

The historic St. Agnes Cemetery in Menands was incorporated in 1867 during the Rural Cemetery Movement of the mid-19th Century. One of the Albany Diocesan Cemeteries, St. Agnes Cemetery continues to serve the Albany Catholic community as a sacred place of burial. Today, the cemetery is comprised of 114 acres and contains over 85,000 burials.

To commemorate Memorial Day and Flag Day, and to honor the many veterans who served our country in time of need, St. Agnes Cemetery, in conjunction with the Albany Aqua Ducks, is sponsoring a Trolley Tour of the military graves of beautiful St. Agnes Cemetery, on Saturday, June 13, 2009, from 10:00 to 12 noon.

Local historian Mark Bodnar will guide you on a special “**Military Tour of St. Agnes Cemetery**”. Weaving a tapestry of military interest, genealogical research and local history, you’ll visit the graves of some prominent, and some not-so-prominent, people from the Albany area that served in various wars. Soldiers of the Nicaraguan Campaign, the Civil War, the Spanish American War, World Wars I and II, the Korean War, The Vietnam War, and the Iraq War are all represented on the tour. You will also be introduced to two Medal of Honor recipients on the tour route.

The tour will start at the Cemetery Office at 10:00 AM. The Trolley will take us to several stops in various sections of the cemetery. The graves we will visit reflect the history of people from the Albany area that served in the military, all of whom have unique and interesting stories to be told. Estimated touring time is 2 hours.

LOVE ONE ANOTHER

In the Gospel for the Sixth Sunday of Easter we are met with an extraordinary challenge: Jesus commands us to “love one another as I love you” (John 15:12). The letter from John echoes this command. Of course, we are to love those in our family, those we work with, those we like. But the scriptures make clear that we are also to love those we never notice, those we purposely avoid, and even those we are tempted to despise.

In this Sunday’s selection from the Acts of the Apostles Peter shows us how far God’s love extends, and how far our love should extend in response. Peter realizes that God no longer “shows partiality” to the Jews, sharing divine love exclusively with them. Christ has revealed that God’s love extends to all people, and so should ours.

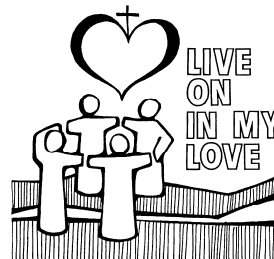

+ In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles God's call is extended beyond the Jewish population to the Gentile world, and to each one who strives to listen to the word of God, *"acts uprightly"* and responds to His loving invitation. The apostles needed to grapple with this truth and learn to think "outside the box". *Are there people who you would tend to exclude from your circle of friends because of differences? Is God asking you to be more inclusive?*

In his letter John begs his community to *"love one another"* asking them to open their eyes to those around them. Those who love - know God and reveal His Presence through their words and deeds. The sacrificial love of Jesus was only the beginning. It needed to be shared. *How do you experience God's love? Who are the people John is urging you to love more completely? Will you love them for Christ's sake?*

John's gospel clarifies the loving relationship that Jesus calls us to. Our relationship is to be one of deep friendship and a willingness to give all for others. *Who would you be willing to die for? In what areas of your life do you need to grow more loving? Are you willing to change? Will you ask the Lord to change you?*

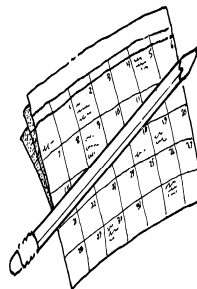
