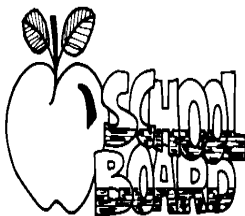


SO DO I SEND YOU

Fifty days after Easter Sunday we celebrate the fulfillment of all God's promises in the feast of Pentecost, a feast that has sometimes been called the birthday of the church. One last time we are reminded that we Christians have received the Holy Spirit, not for our own benefit, but to enable us to follow our Christian vocation.

The centerpiece of the scriptures for Pentecost is the account in Acts of the Apostles of the sending of the Holy Spirit to the disciples. The other readings for this Sunday help us to understand what it means to live out our Christian vocation. Paul's letter shows us the gifts and fruits that the Holy Spirit gives to us. John's Gospel reminds us that Jesus has sent all his disciples to share his forgiveness and peace, through the power of the Holy Spirit.

REMEMBERING AT THE DOOR

What was the first thing you did today as you entered the church? The very first ritual gesture we are invited to make is the dipping of our hand in a font or vessel of holy water. We then make a sign of the cross. For so many of us this gesture has become routine and its potential impact passes us by. Obviously, we make this gesture to remind us that baptism was our entry, our initiation, into the Church. Each time we come to worship, we remind ourselves that we are baptized believers. In order to recover the meaning of this gesture, many people have begun to add an extra remembrance to this gesture. When making the sign of the cross with the holy water, consider bringing to mind those who initially brought you to the sacrament of baptism—your parents and godparents.

BAPTISM AS THE ROOT OF VOCATION

On this great feast of Pentecost, when we celebrate the inrushing of the Holy Spirit, it is good for us to recall our own baptism. Baptism is at the foundation of each Christian's call, or vocation, to share in the ministry of Jesus Christ. For some, this means a response to the call to ordained ministry. For the vast majority of us, our vocation is played out in life's relationships and everyday situations. Our ordained leaders have the responsibility of inspiring us to do the work of building the reign of God in those places where our daily routines take us: school, work, the gym, the supermarket, the mall, our dinner tables, around the television, or at the computer. At our baptism, we were given the gift of the Holy Spirit. In confirmation, we were sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit. The power to share in the ministry of Christ is planted within us. Let us be open to rediscovering the power of the Holy Spirit on this Pentecost and throughout the coming year.

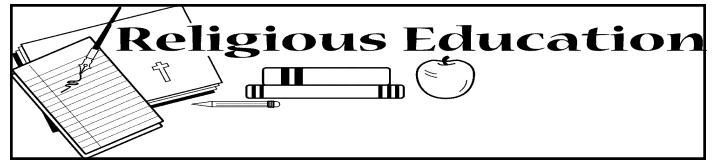

"... As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit.'"

+ The first reading from the Acts of the Apostles proclaims the events of the first Pentecost. The Spirit transforms those gathered in fear in the upper room to a group of courageous believers. The power of Jesus' resurrection bursts forth through the Spirit of God alive in the apostles and disciples and His impact still ripples down through the generations. *How have you been transformed by the Spirit of God? Or do your fears still keep your faith locked within your heart?*

In the second reading, St. Paul urges the believers to allow the Spirit to guide them to develop spiritual gifts and to use them for the honor and glory of God, yes, for the benefit of all. *Since the last time we celebrated Pentecost, have you grown in the gifts and fruits of the Spirit? Do you see yourself as more loving, joyful, and generous? Have you found peace as you become more patient? Has kindness and gentleness become your goals? Has faithfulness and self-control become a way of life?*

John's gospel tells of the Spirit's role in our mission and life purpose. Jesus has given us His Spirit and sends us out as disciples for God's purpose, making forgiveness a way of life. *Have you unlocked the door of your heart to let Christ in? Will you accept His peace and receive His Spirit as the guiding force in your life? Are you ready for your "marching orders"? Are you prayerfully listening?*

Pentecost is our yearly celebration of the birthday of the church. Together, let's pray for a "new birth" through the Spirit and renewal of our church as it lives Christ's mission in the world today.

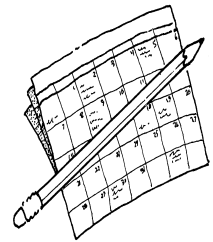
BUT THE SAME SPIRIT



The disciples gathered on the fiftieth day after the Resurrection were not keeping their first Pentecost. For them, Pentecost was the fiftieth day after Passover, a feast of the first fruits of the harvest. It was the second most important feast of the year. Today, Jews gather on the eve of the feast to study scripture and the law, and after the feast

begins at sundown, spend the day in joyful social gatherings. The meaning of the celebration is the giving of the law on Mount Sinai, so for Christians the connection to the gifts of the Holy Spirit is obvious. In Sicily and in the Pantheon in Rome, today the descent of the Holy Spirit is enacted with a stunning ritual. Some churches there have an "eye" in the roof open to the sky, called an "oculus." After the Gospel today, thousands of rose petals fall from the oculus onto the assembly. Churches and homes are decked in greenery and flowers to express the new life the Holy Spirit brings on this, the "Birthday of the Church."

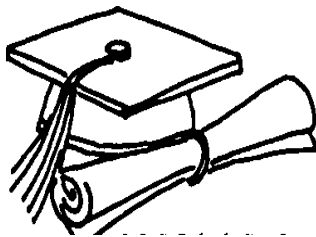

CEMETERY**
A Tradition of Faith

The historic St. Agnes Cemetery in Menands was incorporated in 1867 during the Rural Cemetery Movement of the mid-19th Century. One of the Albany Diocesan Cemeteries, St. Agnes Cemetery continues to serve the Albany Catholic community as a sacred place of burial. Today, the cemetery is comprised of 114 acres and contains over 85,000 burials.

To commemorate Memorial Day and Flag Day, and to honor the many veterans who served our country in time of need, St. Agnes Cemetery, in conjunction with the Albany Aqua Ducks, is sponsoring a Trolley Tour of the military graves of beautiful St. Agnes Cemetery, on Saturday, June 13, 2009, from 10:00 to 12 noon.

Local historian Mark Bodnar will guide you on a special "Military Tour of St. Agnes Cemetery". Weaving a tapestry of military interest, genealogical research and local history, you'll visit the graves of some prominent, and some not-so-prominent, people from the Albany area that served in various wars. Soldiers of the Nicaraguan Campaign, the Civil War, the Spanish American War, World Wars I and II, the Korean War, The Vietnam War, and the Iraq War are all represented on the tour. You will also be introduced to two Medal of Honor recipients on the tour route.

The tour will start at the Cemetery Office at 10:00 AM. The Trolley will take us to several stops in various sections of the cemetery. The graves we will visit reflect the history of people from the Albany area that served in the military, all of whom have unique and interesting stories to be told. Estimated touring time is 2 hours.
