**Statement of the Catholic Bishops
of New York State on Marriage**

We face today the prospect of a law in New York which would radically change the timeless institution of marriage. As pastors of citizens from every corner of our great state, we stand unified in our strong opposition to such a drastic measure.

Throughout history, different cultures have had different customs regarding marriage. But the one constant has been the conviction that marriage is the union of a man and a woman in an enduring bond, ordered for the procreation and stable rearing of children. Regrettably, the state Assembly has voted to redefine what nature and our common heritage long ago defined for us. We fervently pray that members of the state Senate will stand firm in opposition to this ill-advised legislation, and we call on Catholics and all New Yorkers to contact their Senators to make their voices heard. Our opposition to this bill is based not only on Catholic teaching regarding human and the Sacrament of Marriage. Just as importantly, it is based on reason, sound public policy, and plain common sense, as we stated in our 2008 pastoral statement on same-sex "marriage." (The statement can be found at www.nycatholic.org) To briefly reiterate, the state has a compelling legal interest in promoting marriage between men and women in order to create stable families and provide for the safety, health and well being of children. The state has no such compelling legal interest in recognizing a relationship between two people of the same sex.

If there are injustices against those in relationships other than marriage, those injustices can certainly be reformed and corrected in a way other than by drastically redefining marriage.

We close with a final point from our 2008 statement: "(W)e want to make absolutely clear that our firm beliefs about marriage ... must not be misconstrued to be in any way a condemnation of people or an attack on their human dignity. Our Church teaches, and we affirm, that we must treat our sisters and brothers with dignity and love, as we would all God's children. Indeed the Catechism of the Catholic Church warns that any form of prejudice or hatred – "every sign of unjust discrimination" – against people should be avoided. (CCC 2358)

THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK
– JUNE 28 - 12:00 PM MASS**

"Is any one among you sick? Let him call for the presbyters of the Church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins he will be forgiven."

On Sunday June 28 , 2009 during the noon liturgy, you will have the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of The Anointing of the Sick. It is available to us to strengthen and heal us, and to give us the peace and courage to endure the sufferings of illness and old age in a Christian manner. The rite reflects Jesus' concern for the sick and invokes special graces on those whose physical health, age, or circumstance move them to cry out to Jesus for healing. Through this communal celebration we join together to pray with and for the aged, the ill, those with an upcoming surgery or those with emotional distress.

Anyone who is chronically ill, elderly, frail, or emotionally distressed is invited to receive this sacrament and participate in this celebration. It will strengthen you in the difficulties of your illness or age and fortify you in the struggles of your life. Through it the Holy Spirit it will lead you to healing within your soul and your body if that is God's will.

Corpus Christi Celebration

This Sunday, June 14th is The Feast of Corpus Christi. We will celebrate this Solemnity in a special way here at St. Pius X Church on Sunday, June 14th at the 10:00 am Mass. At the conclusion of Mass, a procession with the First Communion Class will lead us around the church and then outside where songs, prayers and Benediction will highlight the celebration. Refreshments will be served after the procession and Benediction. Please join us in this special celebration for the Feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus. There will also be a "Welcoming" for our New Parishioners following the procession.

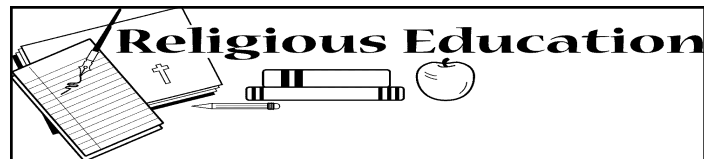

+ The first reading from Exodus presents the covenant the Israelites made with God. The rituals described in the reading seal their commitment. *How do you live out your commitment to God through your Baptism and Confirmation? Have you been unfaithful at times, like the Israelites? Where do you find help to be faithful?*

The letter to the Hebrews proclaims our cleansing through the sacrificial offering of Jesus on the cross. It is a reminder that with His new covenant, even though we are unfaithful, Christ has delivered us from our transgressions. *When you are aware of your own sinfulness and failure to keep your commitment to live as a disciple of Christ, what do you do? Do you seek His face or try to run away? Have you turned to the Lord for His grace flowing from the cross?*

In Mark's account of the Last Supper we are reminded that all disciples receive a gift through the Eucharist. Because of His Passion and His loving sacrifice, Eucharist offers us strength and nourishment to live out our mission as the "Body of Christ". This is our commitment as participants in the new covenant... WE ARE TO BECOME WHAT WE EAT... THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST.

For more than two years, the Marjorie Doyle Rockwell Center has sponsored an **Alzheimer's Care Team** through St. Pius X's Pastoral Care Office. **The Faith-in-Action Care Team** of volunteers provides social support to individuals and families living with Alzheimer's disease or other memory impairment disorders. **We would like to set up a second team to provide assistance and non-medical support to individuals in need. The average commitment is 5 hours per month and volunteers are trained and continually supported.**

The Faith-in-Action Care Team

- provides friendly visits
- picks up a prescription or groceries
- drops off a plate of homemade cookies
- shares a meal
- provides respite so the caregiver can go out with a friend, work in his/her garden, pay bills or take a nap
- assists with transportation
- offers support to the caregiver

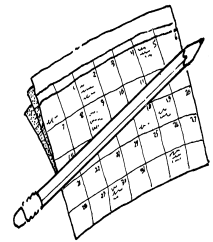

**HISTORIC
ST. AGNES
CEMETERY**
A Tradition of Faith


The historic St. Agnes Cemetery in Menands was incorporated in 1867 during the Rural Cemetery Movement of the mid-19th Century. One of the Albany Diocesan Cemeteries, St. Agnes Cemetery continues to serve the Albany Catholic community as a sacred place of burial. Today, the cemetery is comprised of 114 acres and contains over 85,000 burials.

To commemorate Memorial Day and Flag Day, and to honor the many veterans who served our country in time of need, St. Agnes Cemetery, in conjunction with the Albany Aqua Ducks, is sponsoring a Trolley Tour of the military graves of beautiful St. Agnes Cemetery, on Saturday, June 13, 2009, from 10:00 to 12 noon.

Local historian Mark Bodnar will guide you on a special “**Military Tour of St. Agnes Cemetery**”. Weaving a tapestry of military interest, genealogical research and local history, you’ll visit the graves of some prominent, and some not-so-prominent, people from the Albany area that served in various wars. Soldiers of the Nicaraguan Campaign, the Civil War, the Spanish American War, World Wars I and II, the Korean War, The Vietnam War, and the Iraq War are all represented on the tour. You will also be introduced to two Medal of Honor recipients on the tour route.

The tour will start at the Cemetery Office at 10:00 AM. The Trolley will take us to several stops in various sections of the cemetery. The graves we will visit reflect the history of people from the Albany area that served in the military, all of whom have unique and interesting stories to be told. Estimated touring time is 2 hours.
