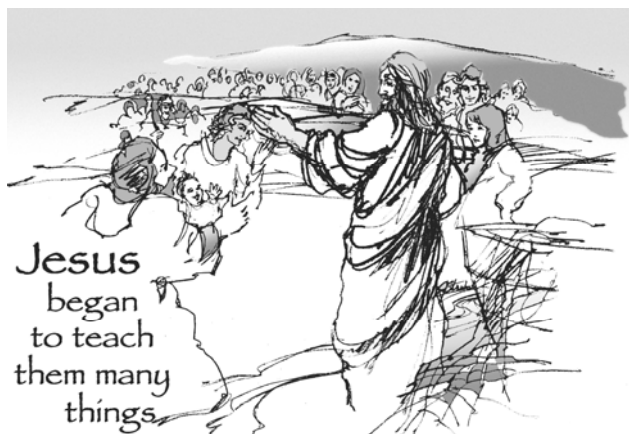

**NOT ME!**

Harsh words from Jeremiah today. Or more precisely, harsh words from the Lord, spoken through the prophetic mouth of Jeremiah. Lucky for us that these words are directed at somebody else, those “shepherds” who are misleading the sheep of God’s pasture. The shepherds, after all, are those who are in official positions, who hold hierarchical status, or who, at the very least, get paid a salary by the diocese or parish. It is easy enough to point a finger and say that, come to think of it, those shepherds have been misleading the flock lately. But it is perilous to ignore the voice of the Lord on the prophets’ lips. The divine will of which they speak applies to everybody, and contains some truth about all of our lives. No matter what we might think our role or place is within the fold, each of us has some responsibility to be a shepherd in daily living. In the smallest acts of justice, charity, or compassion we are living out the call of our covenant with the Lord: to be God’s voice, God’s presence, God’s caring and guiding hand in the world.

**YES, YOU!**

The apostle Paul tells us that in Christ we all have access in one Spirit to the Father. With this tremendous and wonderful gift comes the responsibility to make it a gift again for the life of the world. As Christ made peace through the blood of his cross, as he reconciled earth with heaven, we are called to continue that peace making, reconciling work day by day. Each week we gather with Jesus Christ as the apostles do in today’s Gospel. We pray in the Eucharistic Prayer: “May this sacrifice, which has made our peace with you, advance the peace and salvation of all the world.” Each of us, baptized into the one Body of Christ, saved by the blood of his cross that we share in one cup, are chosen and called for the mission of shepherding in his name. If we take but a moment to look around, we can easily see that there are many places where people are like sheep without a shepherd. Are our hearts, filled with the presence of the Good Shepherd, moved with pity for them? More important, are our lives moved to action?

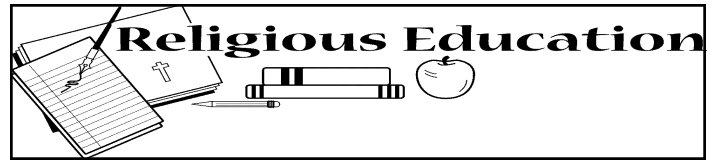
**Youth in Ministry Appreciation Trip**

## PASTORAL CARE NEWS

*"I myself will gather the remnant of my flock from all the lands to which I have driven them and bring them back to their meadow; there they shall increase and multiply."*

+In the first reading the prophet Jeremiah offers hope to God's people. His words echo the Lord's warning to the corrupt and powerful and promise a true shepherd, Jesus Son of David. *In your role as leader do you misuse your power? Do you seek leadership roles to live out your Christian values? When was the last time you prayed for those who God has given power to shepherd you?*

In his letter St. Paul gently reminds the Ephesians that Jesus brings peace for all. He proclaims the Holy Spirit is available to all because of Christ's suffering and death. That means both leader and follower, and those who draw near to the Lord and those who are alienated by sinful practices have access to the living God. Even today it gives us a reason to hope especially during the most difficult times. When discouragement engulfs us, we can be assured that there is always the Spirit who transforms us if we are open to a change of heart and mind. *Is it time for you to draw nearer to the Lord? Will you open your mind and heart to the Spirit's work?*

In today's gospel from Mark, Jesus and His apostles were seeking a bit of rest in a deserted place. Yet, the crowds followed them and Jesus' heart was moved by love. He reached out to meet their needs as every true shepherd would. Here the Spirit of God changed His mind and His plans. *How flexible are you in the way of love? Are you willing to change your plans to do the Lord's bidding?*

For more than two years, the Marjorie Doyle Rockwell Center has sponsored an **Alzheimer's Care Team** through St. Pius X's Pastoral Care Office. **The Faith-in-Action Care Team** of volunteers provides social support to individuals and families living with Alzheimer's disease or other memory impairment disorders. **We would like to set up a second team to provide assistance and non-medical support to individuals in need. The average commitment is 5 hours per month and volunteers are trained and continually supported.**

### *The Faith-in-Action Care Team*

- provides friendly visits
- picks up a prescription or groceries
- drops off a plate of homemade cookies
- shares a meal
- provides respite so the caregiver can go out with a friend, work in his/her garden, pay bills or take a nap
- assists with transportation
- offers support to the caregiver

Each team receives training and support from the Eddy Alzheimer Services.
