WEEKLY MIRACLE

This week marks the beginning of a kind of “liturgical de-tour.” We have been listening to Saint Mark’s Gospel during this liturgical year (Year B). Today we begin to hear a long section from John’s Gospel, starting with the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes. This miracle story is a prelude to the Lord’s statements that we will begin hearing in a few weeks, where Jesus refers to himself as the “bread of life.” Each week we witness a miracle at Mass. We do not see a multiplication of loaves before us. What our eyes of faith allow us to see is the miracle of the transformation of common elements—bread and wine—into the Lord’s body and blood. Once we have received the Lord, the multiplication begins, for in the Eucharist we are strengthened to multiply our efforts to feed the poor, shelter the homeless, and bring comfort to the despairing.

PETER’S PENCE COLLECTION THIS WEEKEND

Every year, when the Peter’s Pence Collection is taken up around the world to support the works of the Holy Father, Catholics in the United States are extraordinarily generous. The proceeds of this Collection are used to provide emergency funds to those who suffer from oppression, disease, war, or natural disaster.

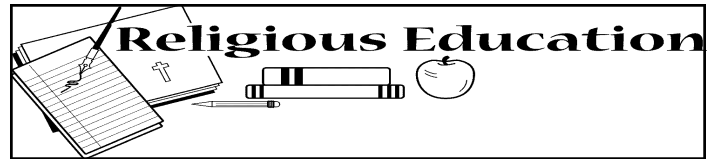


Youth in Ministry Appreciation Trip

PASTORAL CARE NEWS

"I, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to live in a manner worthy of the call you have received, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love, striving to preserve the unity of the spirit through the bond of peace:"

+ In 2 Kings, Elisha's servant objected to the distribution of 20 barley loaves to the people, insisting that it was not enough food for the hundred gathered. Elisha was sure that the Lord would take care of everyone's needs. His faithful persistence revealed this to be true. In fact there was more than enough ... with leftovers besides. *Do you fear the present? ... That there won't be enough money, time, energy etc. to do what God wants?* Look to the Lord. He is faithful.

In John's gospel narrative of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes, the same is true. Philip didn't believe there was enough to feed the multitudes. It was Jesus who challenged him to believe in the Father's magnificent care and love. God always provides enough. In fact He even provides leftovers, to reserve for later and for others. *Do you trust the Lord to take care of it all when you follow His way and do His will?* Take heart you are truly loved.

In St. Paul's letter, the Ephesians are urged to live a virtuous life striving for peace through *"the unity of the Spirit"*. It is difficult for those lacking trust in the Lord's benevolence to find peace. That is why Jesus has continued to nourish us through the His Eucharistic banquet. He wants to give us His peace so we can be free to feed a world hungry for Christ. He has called us to trust in Him as we strive to live virtuous lives of loving service. *Are you hungry for holiness?* He will feed your soul!

Look to this week's readings to give you hope when you think you've "had enough"! You will find He is enough.

THESE FAMILIES NEED YOUR HELP! Alzheimer's Disease or other types of memory impairments have affected many people. Caring for someone with dementia can be both isolating and exhausting for family members. Creating a Faith-In-Action Care Team is one way a parish may respond.

For more than two years, the Marjorie Doyle Rockwell Center has sponsored an **Alzheimer's Care Team** through St. Pius X's Pastoral Care Office. **The Faith-in-Action Care Team** of volunteers provides social support to individuals and families living with Alzheimer's disease or other memory impairment disorders. We would like to set up a second team to provide assistance and non-medical support to individuals in need. The average commitment is 5 hours per month and volunteers are trained and continually supported.

The Faith-in-Action Care Team

provides friendly visits, picks up a prescription or groceries drops off a plate of homemade cookies, shares a meal, provides respite so the caregiver can go out with a friend, work in his/her garden, pay bills or take a nap, assists with transportation-offers support to the caregiver
Each team receives training and support from the Eddy Alzheimer Services. If you have any questions, would like more information, and/or would like to volunteer please call Jeanne Pitkin at 462-1336.

BAPTISM AND GODPARENTS by Paul Turner

Everyone baptized into the church receives a godparent. Godparents assist the baptized “to lead a Christian life in harmony with baptism and to fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it.” That means we ask very little or very much, depending on how you look at it.

To be a godparent you must be 16, baptized, confirmed in the Catholic Church, taking communion with us, leading a life in harmony with faith, and not a parent of the one to be baptized. Godparents may be chosen by the one to be baptized, by the parents or guardians, or even by the pastor or parish minister. A baptized non-Catholic may serve as a witness to the baptism if a Catholic godparent also takes part.

Only one godparent is needed, although two may serve. The baptismal godparent becomes the preferred sponsor for confirmation. Very often people will ask a family member to be a godparent. This has the advantage of binding families together. However a godparent from the parish community may make a better choice. A parishioner can set a good example for the child from week to week and can represent the role of the entire parish community bringing Christ to each new member.

Some families have further expectations of godparents of young children. They may expect a gift at the child’s birthday or further assistance throughout life. Some godparents devote a lot of time with their godchildren; others do not. The church does not specify these extended responsibilities; families may discuss them with their godparents.

Godparents for adults play an important role during lent. They support the catechumen at the rite of election and the scrutinies in addition to the rites of initiation. They usually are the sponsors who have accompanied the catechumens throughout their preparation. If the adult joining the church has already been baptized, his/her sponsor remains a “sponsor” since a godparent already exists.

During infant baptism, we ask godparents if they will help the parents in their duty as Christian parents. We invite them to renew their baptismal vows together with the parents, and they may assist in lighting the child’s candle. However, parents hold the child for the baptism.
