From the Pastor's Desk

With all of the debate surrounding health care reform, sometimes it is good to take a step back and think about some fundamental moral principles from our Catholic tradition that ought to guide our thinking. Archbishop Gregory Aymond, of New Orleans, authored the following statement. You may find it helpful in your own thinking.

“The Catholic bishops in the United States recognize a pressing need for health care reform. Too many American citizens lack basic health care coverage and the cost of health care is becoming prohibitive for many more.

The Lord Jesus, who came to save us from our sins, manifested a great concern for the sick in his public ministry. He also urged us to reach out to the poor and sick in our midst. The Church rightly considers that government has a responsibility to ensure access to basic health care for all.

The bishops do not propose a specific plan or policy. But we set out the following principles to shape public policy:

- We need to develop a plan which ensures access to basic health care for all.
- We need to make sure that the poor and the vulnerable, including legal immigrants, are part of this plan.
- We need to control health care costs so that it is affordable to all.
- We need to make sure that abortion, euthanasia or other immoral activities are not mandated or financed with taxpayer dollars. This includes conscience protection for all providers, whether institutions or individual persons, and for all recipients.

The bishops, without proposing either a public or private sector option, urge that any plan which is developed embrace these principles. Catholics are urged to contact their United States Senators and Representative to ask them to use these principles to evaluate all proposals that are developed.

Strident or shrill rhetoric does not help us to engage in civil and respectful deliberation about a serious social issue with significant moral implications. God grant us the wisdom to discern what is right and the courage to do it.”

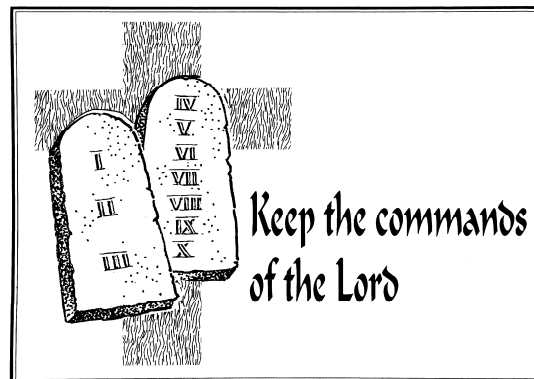
I also refer you to the web site for the *United States Conference of Catholic Bishops*. You may click on the site designated for the official position of the Bishops' Conference.

President Obama has often said that the status quo is no longer an option. As far as the poor are concerned, that has been true for many decades. It is our poor brothers and sisters who are the primary concern for all of us in the Church. Singularly significant among those poor are women and children.

Please join me in praying that a health care reform bill may be fashioned that makes quality medical care available to the poorest and most vulnerable among us while protecting the rights of every individual to choose the care that most suits his/her needs. As a Church you and I are always challenged to be aware of the preferential option for the poor and vulnerable to which the Gospel calls us, and be willing to sacrifice for the sake of that option.

When Jesus declared: “The poor you will always have with you” he was not calling his disciples to indifference but to action; action that is motivated by his Gospel of love. We pray for all decision makers and for all who have a heavy stake in health care reform. May the Holy Spirit's guidance be experienced in their deliberations and may the common good prevail.

THE HIGHEST LAW

From time to time, newspapers and magazines will offer, as an item of “filler,” various laws that are still on the books but seem silly to us in our day and age. In one California city, it is illegal to have two indoor bathtubs in one house. Clean water, a precious commodity when the law was written, is now readily available, so the law seems silly. But the human value of protecting and preserving precious resources is still around, evident in many conservation laws that seem sensible to us. So it is with the laws of religious tradition. What Jesus scorns today is others' attitude toward ritual laws, an attitude that becomes nearly idolatrous when laws are observed for their own sake. What Jesus teaches today is that observation of external ritual laws is of value only when they are emblems of our internal disposition toward the will of God. Our whole lives must follow the one ultimate law of God: to love God completely and to love neighbor entirely. Roman Catholicism is a tradition rich with customs, traditions, and even laws. As we continue to listen to the voice of Christ, we must always look into our own hearts and underneath our ritual practices to make sure that love of God and love of neighbor are what we prize above all.

In order to respond more consistently with compassion and prayer beyond our Sunday commitment, the names of those who are seriously ill are printed below.



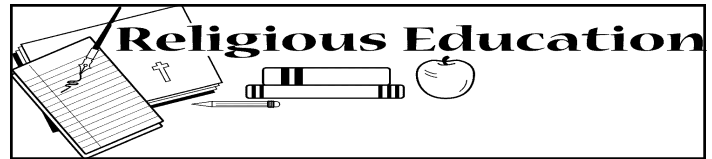

+ In Deuteronomy, Moses teaches the Israelites the importance of observing the Lord’s commandments to develop a relationship with Him. *What sabotages your growing relationship with the Lord?*

In his letter St. James demands that the Church become **“doers of the word and not hears only”**. He recognizes the importance of our actions in building a right relationship with the Lord and His people. It is imperative that we live according to God’s word and obey His laws. *Where has your life gone haywire when trying to live out the gospel message?*

In Mark’s gospel Jesus clarifies the difference between God’s law and human tradition. He wants the Pharisees to set their hearts on His priorities and stop misinterpreting the law and clinging to their traditions. Jesus invites all of us to make our hearts right with Him by forming a new relationship with Him. He wishes to write God’s law within our hearts so we will no longer be bound by undesirable human traditions. *What traditions do you follow that keep you from doing or accepting the Father’s will?*
