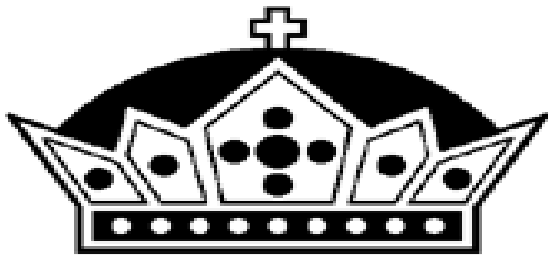

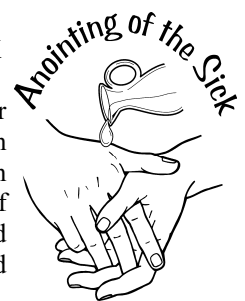
Equinox Thanksgiving Dinner

THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK DEC. 6TH - 12:00 PM MASS

"Is any among you sick? Let him call for the presbyters of the Church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins he will be forgiven."



On Sunday December 6, 2009 during the noon liturgy, all will have the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of The Anointing of the Sick. It is available to us to strengthen and heal us, and to give us the peace and courage to endure the sufferings of illness and old age in a Christian manner. The rite reflects Jesus' concern for the sick and invokes special graces on those whose physical health, age, or circumstance move them to cry out to Jesus for healing. Through this communal celebration we join together to pray with and for the aged, the ill, those with an upcoming surgery or those with emotional distress. Anyone who is ill, elderly, frail, or emotionally distressed is invited to receive this sacrament and participate in this celebration. It will strengthen you in the difficulties of your illness or age and fortify you in the struggles of your life.

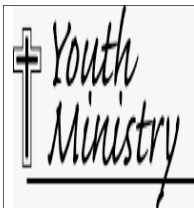

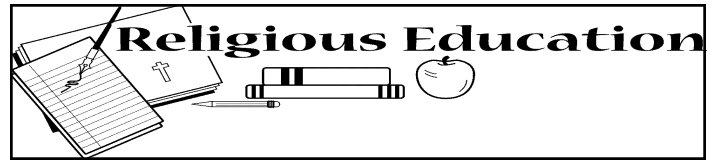

+ The first reading from the prophet Daniel proclaims the kingdom of God where a human person, believed to be Jesus, reigns over all mankind. *Does Jesus have dominion over your humanity? Have you given your heart to Him?*

In the second reading, Revelations speaks of the immense expanse of God's reign. Revealing Christ's divinity we see He reigns over the past, present and future. Yes, over all time! *Will you let Jesus heal your past, rule over the present, and plan for your future?* If you do, then you no longer need to worry!

The readings for the Feast of Christ the King conclude with John's gospel, Pilate's encounter with Our Lord Jesus. Here Jesus explains that His kingdom has no political or military implications. He does not seek worldly powers but invites all to seek the Truth. *Are you as confused by life's circumstances as Pilate was? Do you long to know the real truth? Are you actively seeking Christ's kingdom?* Jesus is inviting all of us to a new way of thinking and a new way of living, Kingdom Living.

Listen to His voice so you may share more deeply in His Kingdom!

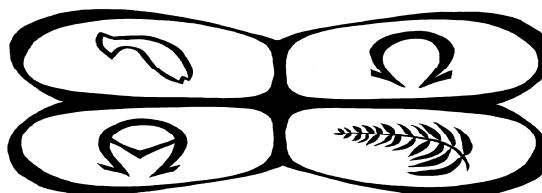

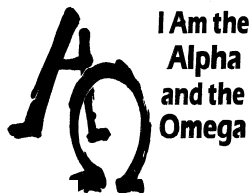

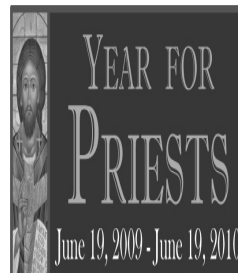
