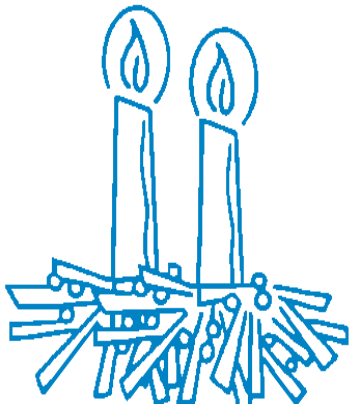

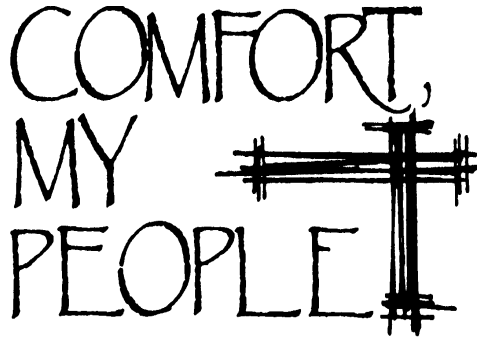

NEWS OF COMFORT

In a time of preparation, much of it having to do with material things, it is good to hear the words of Isaiah, "Comfort, give comfort to my people, / says your God" (Isaiah 40:1). In a time of such stress and rush, when our usual burdens are augmented by piles of Christmas preparations, we can choose to slow down, take some time to heal, and appreciate the enormous gift we are about to receive. Christ, the Son of God, has become one of us, and knows our human limitations. Yet God, even now, is freeing us from the burdens that our inattentiveness to our God and to our deepest inner longings have heaped upon us. The Lord comes, not as a king with mighty armies, but as a shepherd leading the flocks with care and tenderness. Isaiah prophesies good news: our oppression is over, our sins forgiven. The savior we have awaited is coming, not the first time, but in the end times, as our salvation.

St. Pius X School Students Help Feed the Hungry

Before Thanksgiving, St. Pius X Parish School held a food drive for the Sacred Heart Food Pantry in North Albany. By the time the drive ended, the students had collected over 4,000 items. On November 14th a 4th and a 5th grade class represented the entire school as they took a bus to the food pantry to deliver the donations to Sister Sara. Once there, they unloaded the hundreds of bags of food and quickly sorted them for Sister and her volunteers. In addition to the several food drives the school conducts each year on behalf of Sacred Heart, each week St. Pius X School families cook meatloaves, freeze them, and then deliver them for "Meatloaf Wednesdays."

Food for the hungry, hundreds of "Coats for Kids," donations of necessities to The Blue Star Mothers to support our soldiers, and a Christmas Giving Tree for some of our own school families in need are just a few ways our students live the Gospel message each day.

On behalf of the students and staff at St. Pius X School, we hope that your Thanksgiving was blessed and that your Christmas will be filled with peace and happiness.

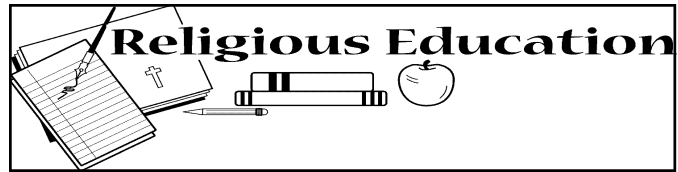

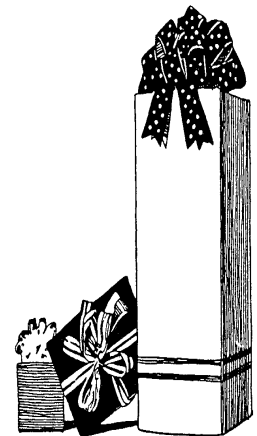

“Comfort, give comfort to my people, says your God.”

+ The reading from Isaiah offers us hope during this Advent season. It reassures us of God’s power and might yet proclaims His tenderness and love for us as we yield to His care as sheep to their shepherd. *Will you let Jesus shepherd you in your Advent journey?*

In his letter, St. Peter reminds us that the Lord is patient with us, wanting no one to perish but rather desiring each to eagerly grow in holiness. He craves a people devoted to His ultimate goodness and will. *Are you seeking holiness through righteous living?*

Mark’s gospel clearly reveals John the Baptist’s mission as prophesized in Isaiah. His baptism, a call to repentance, prepared the people of Judea and Jerusalem to receive the forgiveness of sins through Jesus, the Christ. He wanted all to welcome God’s awesome gift in Jesus and open their hearts to the relational love given with the Holy Spirit. *How open are you to these transforming gifts from God? Will you let the Holy Spirit guide you to your own rebirth?*

THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK SUNDAY DECEMBER 7TH NOON MASS

“Suffering and illness have always been among the greatest problems that trouble the human spirit. Christians feel and experience pain as do all other people; yet their faith helps them to grasp more deeply the mystery of suffering and to bear their pain with greater courage.”

On Sunday December 7th, 2008, during the noon liturgy, you will have the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of The Anointing of the Sick. It is available to us to strengthen and heal us, and to give us the peace and courage to endure the sufferings of illness and old age in a Christian manner. The rite reflects Jesus’ concern for the sick and invokes special graces on those whose physical health, age, or circumstance move them to cry out to Jesus for healing. Through this communal celebration we join together to pray with and for the aged, the ill, those with an upcoming surgery or those with emotional distress.

Anyone who is chronically ill, elderly, frail, or emotionally distressed is invited to receive this sacrament and participate in this celebration. It will strengthen you in the difficulties of your illness or age and fortify you in the struggles of your life. Through it the Holy Spirit it will lead you to healing within your soul and your body if that is God’s will.

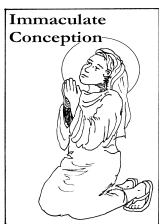

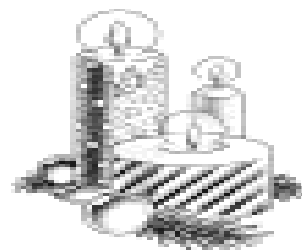
